

Two Lashkar militants killed in Budgam gunfight

Budgam, Jan 17 Two local militants affiliated with Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) were killed in a brief encounter with security forces in near Court Complex in central Kashmir's Budgam district, officials said here on Tuesday.

Talking to reporters on the side-lines of a function in Srinagar, Director General of Police (DGP) Dilbag Singh said that the operation was launched vesterday in Budgam, but after firefight for some time.



the militants gave slip and however, were traced again today.

"During a naka, the militants were traced and were asked to stop for checking,

but they jumped from the vehicle and fired upon the forces and tried to escape the spot," he said and added that the fire was retaliated and the duo belonging to LeT and hailing from Pulwama district were killed during the encounter. "Both the militants were moving towards Srinagar district and the reasons behind will be known after the investigation. They left from their old hideout and were in search of the new hideout," he said, as per the news agency-

No Threat inputs to the Yatra so far: DGP Dilbag Singh

Srinagar, Jan 17: Jammu and Kashmir police chief, Dilbag Singh on Tuesday said that there are no threat inputs to the upcoming Bharat Jodo Yatra and that all security measures have been taken to facilitate it when it reaches the UT.

"I chaired a security review and BJY was also discussed. There is no threat to the Yatra. All security measures will be taken to facilitate it at district and range level," DGP told reporters in Srinagar on the side-lines of a function as per news

Replying to a query, the DGP said police have got some vital clues with regard to the Rajouri attacks and that the success will be achieved soon. The DGP said that police have got some vital clues during the investigation. "The area is close to the forest and after frequent militant



sightings, four-five unsuccessful operations have been launched. As far as investigation is concerned, we have got some solid clues and the arrests will be made soon. I hope that the success will be achieved soon," he said DGP also said that "the main character behind terrorism in J&K and other parts of the country from

across the border is being exposed at international level. The measures are being taken to tighten up the process against the involved people and notify them as terrorists. The profile of these persons is also being sent to the different organizations working against the terrorism.

Meanwhile, DGP chaired a high level security review meeting in Srinagar in which senior officers of Kashmir Zone participated. A police spokesman said that the meeting reviewed the crime and security scenario of the Valley. He said that arrangements for the upcoming Republic Day were also discussed.

Major controversy over participation of Lal Singh in Bharat Jodo Yatra

Congress leader resigns, says former minister defended rapists of young Kathua girl. divided J&K

Jammu, Jan 17): A major controversy has erupted over the participation of former minister Lal Singh in Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra with a lawyer, who was at the forefront of a campaign to seek justice for eight-yearold Kathua child who was gang-raped and murdered in 2018, resigning from the Congress on Tuesday over allowing Singh to participate in the Yatra, which will enter Jammu & Kashmir this week.

In a series of tweets, as per news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Advocate Deepika Pushkar Nath announced her resignation from the party, saying Lal Singh defended the rapists of the girl and divided the entire Jammu & Kashmir to protect the

"In view of Ch.Lal Singh's proposal of joining @bharatjodo & @INCJammu-Kashmir allowing the same, I am left with no other option but to resign from @INCIndia .Lal Singh was responsible in sabotaging the Kathua rape case in 2018 by brazenly defending rapists, Deepika tweeted.

Deepika, who was also spokesperson of J&K unit of Congress, said Lal Singh divided the entire region of Jammu



& Kashmir to protect the rapists and Bharat Jodo Yatra is ideologically opposite to actions of the former minis-

"Lal Singh divided the entire region of Jammu & Kashmir to protect the rapists and @bharatjodo is ideologically opposite. On ideological grounds, I cannot share the party platform with such a person," she said

Srinagar, Jan 17 Traditional chainstitch craft is witnessing slow death with craft restricted to old generation

Mohammad Irfan Wani, a chain stitch artist from Malchemar Aali Kadal told news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), that his family has been associated with 'Jalakdozi' craft for the last 200 years. But he is worried the craft which his forefathers introduced in his family will have no takers now.

"I will be the last person in my family to be associated with the art as none is ready to learn. Also, there is a low demand for chain stitch items. An artisan earns a mere Rs 100-150 per day and they can't sustain their families," he said.



Cardiac Heath Issues Amid Intense Cold...

Heart Attacks/Strokes on Abrupt rise.

even people lost their lives to heart Attacks on 13th January across Kashmir Valley. Come Winter and Health Issues flair up due to intense and biting Chill during 40 day of extreme cold known as CHI-LAI-E-KALAAN. Cardiac health issues top the list followed by brain Strokes. This winter not only Kashmir valley witnesses extreme dry cold weather conditions, however entire north India is facing the similar music Just last week a shocking news broked out from Kanpur in UP that 27 people lost their lives in a single day due to Heart Attacks and Strokes. The reason being severe Cold Wave across entire north India from last one week.

Severe Cold weather conditions continue across Kashmir Valley too, accompanied by related health issues. Although 40 days of intense Chill, CHELAI-KALAAN began on a positive note with no major change in weathimprovement in temperatures. However the Cold wave has intensified in Kashmir and will increase with the beginning of "Chillai Kalan" which begain from December 21. Though winter brings many memories, it increases the problems for those who have cardiac and hypertensive problems. According to the doctors, people mostly elderly with hypertension have to take precautionary measures in winters as it might increase the chances of haemorrhages. They say that winter can be a challenging time for people suffering from hypertension. When the temperatures are below freezing point in Kashmir and going out in those conditions can be dangerous for people with hypertension problems. Winters, especially the harshest period, chillai kalan causes higher blood pressure levels. The doctors believe that hypertensive patients need to cover their head properly and keep their body warm especially during nights when the temperatures are very low. Besides these issues, Cardiac arrests are often on rise during winters. Experts want people to limit outdoor activities to reduce workload on the heart during freezing conditions. They also suggest that weightlifting and taking heavy loads should be limited in winters especially for those who have blood pressure issues. Winters can be challenging for elderly as well as comorbid patients and they need to take extra care. Researchers say possible explanations of the cold weather effect include activation of the sympathetic nervous system (which helps control how the body responds to stress) and release of the hormone catecholamine, which may increase blood pressure by speeding the heart rate and decreasing the responsiveness of blood vessels. Because the risk of stroke or aneurysmal rupture is highest in the elderly, improved protection against these diseases by close monitoring of blood pressure and antihypertensive medication when outdoor temperature is very low could be considered. So it's better to take precautions before it's too late.

India is well poised to emerge as a leader in dairy

he country celebrated National Milk Day on the 26th of November. The occasion is momentous because for one it will mark the 101st birth anniversary of late Dr. Verghese Kurien, the man who is credited for ushering in India's 'White Revolution'.

In many ways, the growth and advancements in India's dairy sector have been symbolic of the trajectory of the country's influence and impact on the global map. Under Shri Narendra Modi's leadership, the country's milk production has gone up by more than 44% and in the year 2020-2021, we produced 210 MT of milk, that constitutes 23% of the world's milk. India's per capita milk availability stood at 427 gram per day in 2020-21 as against the world average of 394 grams per day during the same period.

The dairy sector in India has been largely organised under the cooperative structure and the cooperatives have played a pivotal role in increasing the negotiating power of dairy farmers and help set the price of Milk Procurement and Milk Sale in their area of operations. Unlike the scenario for crops like rice and wheat, the Government does not dictate prices of dairy products and is not involved in milk procurement. This has fostered the autonomy of Dairy Cooperatives and encouraged them to be market oriented. In fact, some of the leading dairy cooperatives in the country have managed to surpass private companies in both performance and profits. India's largest dairy company Amul is an excellent testament to the power and success of the Cooperative model within the country.

Now as we recover from the aftermath of the pandemic, it would be worthwhile to highlight the role played by the Government and the dairy cooperatives to support dairy farmers during the lockdown period and beyond. Milk procurement by the dairy cooperatives continued



it accepted the diverted additional milk of the farmers which was otherwise sold to private and unorganised players. Milk procurement by the dairy cooperatives registered an increase of 7.9 per cent during 2020-21. To extend support, the Government of India launched "Interest subvention on Working Capital Loans" component under the existing central sector scheme - "Supporting Dairy Cooperatives and Farmer Producer Organisations engaged in dairy activities (SDCFPO)" scheme. Such measures helped our dairy industry remain resilient in the past two years.

To leverage the growing potential of technology, a digital platform called e-Gopala was launched to enhance ease and efficiency in the management of livestock. This digital platform can be used for obtaining Pashu Aadhaar, Pashu Poshan, Ethno-veterinary Medicines (EVM), Animal Breeding related services and information. Additionally, the E-Gopala App also provides a platform for buying and selling of dairy animals, bovine semen, embryo etc. To supplement the exercise, a helpline for dairy farmers called Pashu Mitra has been established by the National Dairy Development Board, that will enable farmers to directly have their queries on animal health and nutrition answered by experts. Given that Indian milk production 2025, corporations will need to invest in processing facilities, and this provides an investment potential of USD 10 Billion within the dairy sector. There is a chilling infrastructure deficit of roughly 120-130 MMT in dairy sector, which translates into an investment potential of approximately USD 2.6 billion, with a 17-20% expected return on investment over the next 9-12 years. Another impetus for enhancing investments in dairy has to do with our growing footprint in the exports market. For instance, India's cheese exports under the HS Code 0406 have grown at a rate of 16% CAGR during the period 2015-2020. The major export destinations were UAE, Bhutan, and the United States of America. Presently, there are more than 75 milk deficient countries across the globe, with most of them scattered across Asia, Latin America, and Africa – this presents a ripe opportunity for India to make inroads into newer markets. To this end, recent initiatives like the National Digital Livestock Mission will go a long way towards enhancing traceability standards and will enable Indian companies to meet the quality standards set by importing nations.

To boost investments in the dairy sector, DAHD has set up the Dairy Investment Accelerator under which entities like Gates Foundation and Invest India will collaborate to provide pro bono services that will include issue resolution, investment facilitation, assistance with export strategy, market research, location assessment, etc. More importantly, dairying has provided a reliable source of income to traditional farmers when crops have failed. The current Government's efforts have been concentrated on transforming the dairy industry from an unorganized to an organized sector, with the end goal of increasing farmers income, and generation of employment across the value chain. The slew of recent schemes like the Animal Husbandry Infrastructure Development Fund, Rastriya Gokul Mission, Animal Husbandry Grand Start-up Challenge, and the extension of Kisan Credit Card facilities to livestock farmers, will usher in better standards and innovations within our dairy sector. Thus, on the 101st birth anniversary of Dr Kurien, we are confident that India is well poised to emerge as a leading exporter of dairy products in times

Meanwhile, the J&K police in a statement said that acting on specific input regarding movement of terrorists a joint Naka of Police and Army (62RR) was established near Court crossing Budgam. "During area domination, the joint party signalled a suspected vehicle (sumo) bearing registration number JK04B-6771 to stop however, the terrorists on board jumped from the vehicle and started firing indiscriminately on the joint party which was retaliated effectively, leading to an encounter," it said.

"During the brief shoot-out, two terrorists linked with the proscribed terrorist outfit LeT were neutralized and have been identified as Arbaaz Ahmad Mir resident of Putrigam Rajpora and Shahid Ahmad Sheikh resident of Kisrigam, Kakapora," it said.

"As per police records, both the killed terrorists were categorized terrorists and part of groups involved in several terror crime cases. It is pertinent to mention that both the terrorists escaped earlier from the recent encounter in Budgam," the police said, adding that they were tasked to carry out some sensational terror incident in Budgam district ahead of forthcoming Republic Day.

"Incriminating materials, arms & ammunition including 01 AK-47 rifle, 01 pistol were recovered from the site of encounter. All the recovered materials have been taken into case records for further investigation. In this regard, a case under relevant sections of law has been registered and investigation has been initiated," the po-

The army in its statement said that the movement of terrorists of proscribed outfit LeT was being continuously tracked for past few days by the intelligence agencies of Army. "Based on the confirmed input received regarding move of terrorists in the area of Budgam, a joint mobile vehicle check post was launched by Army & JKP by 0930hr on 17 Jan 2023," it said.

"At 09:40 hrs, a suspected Tata Sumo was intercepted by the Security Forces. On being challenged, the terrorists in the vehicle in an attempt to flee, opened indiscriminate fire on the Security Forces," the army said, adding that they did so to create chaos by inflicting casualty to Security Forces & civilians in the crowded area.

"However, the Security Forces exercised complete restrain and cordoned off the terrorists in the nearby shops, where they had sought shelter," it said, adding that the security forces tightened the noose of the area by dynamically reinforcing the area with additional troops and cutting of all possible escape roots.

"While ensuring strict fire control and valuing the civilian life, security forces evacuated the locals to safety. The terrorist however continued with indiscriminate fire on the security forces who were evacuating the locals," it added.

In the ensuing fire fight, the army said that both the dreaded terrorists were eliminated by the precise fire brought down by the security forces. "As per the JKP, the neutralised terrorists have been identified as Sahid Rashid Sheikh, r/o Kisrigom, Kakapora and Arbaz Ah Mir, r/o Putrigam, Pulwama, both belonging to LeT. The search of the area resulted in recovery of one AK series rifle, one pistol and other indiscriminating material," it

"Elimination of these terrorists has given a big jolt to the terrorist tanzeems in the area and has disturbed their nefarious plans of disturbing the peace and tranquillity in the area," the army said—(KNO)

In the meantime, the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment for Government of India (GoI) has said that the implementation of SHRESHTA scheme will provide more opportunities for meritorious SC Boys and Girls to study in the best residential schools in the country. "The scheme is being implemented from the academic year 2022-23.

"Every year, the best CBSE schools with residential facilities would be selected for the scheme. Each selected school is expected to provide admission for at least 10 meritorious SC Boys and Girls selected through the National Entrance Test," it reads.

It also states that the entry for students would be in class 9 and 11 for completion of education upto class 12. The ministry also said, "The selection of the students would be done through the National Entrance Test for SHRESHTA (NETS) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). Every year 3000 students would be provided fresh admissions under the scheme.

GoI also said, "The cost of education of the students will be borne by the Government as per rates by directly transferring the money to the school electronically. Apart from this, there would be separate grants for conducting bridge courses if needed for the students."

Anil Sharma, president of the AJKPC informed the media persons that an order dated 16/Jan/2023 has been issued by the office of Commissioner/Secretary Rural Development wherein all the BDOs have been asked to freeze the funds available with the Panchayats under 14th Finance Commission and submit amount surrender statement by 22/01/2023.Sharma intimated that earlier the union government had issued an order wherein the deadline for utilization of these funds (under 14th FC) was fixed till 31st March 2023 and all the PRI members and the officers of the Rural development department were working accordingly, but out of blue, government order No. 21-JK(RD & PR) of 2023 dated 16/01/2023 has been issued without any application of mind or taking any brief and inputs from the PRI members, Block Development Officers or district level officers(ACDs) of the Rural development department. "Earlier the e-tendering process took so much time and now when the time has come for execution of developmental work, this order for freezing of amount under 14th FC within 6 days has come as a big shock for the elected Panches and Sarpanches as they are accountable to the people unlike the bureaucrats sitting in their cozy chambers of civil secretariat and sipping exotic coffee and juices", Sharma Lamented. The other protestors also vowed to continue such protests outside the civil secretariat if such an authoritarian order is not rescinded back by the government.
