Srinagar, Mar 08,: Two persons were killed after being hit by an ambulance near Children hospital in Bemina area of summer capital Srinagar.An official told news agency Kashmir Dot Com that two persons identified as Ali Mohammad Dar, a resident of Nowpora, Baramulla, and Fayaz Ahmad Chopan, a resident of Hadipora, Rafiabad were critically injured after they were hit by a speedy ambulance near children hospital Bemina in wee hours on Wednesday. Both the injured were shifted to JVC hospital for treatment, where doctors declared them dead on arrival, he said. The driver of the ambulance has been arrested, while the vehicle was seized under relevant sections of law and further investigation of the incident is going on, he added. (KDC)

International Women's Day Women facing domestic violence have nowhere to go in absence of J&K Women's Commission

Srinagar, Mar 08: Amid surge in domestic violence cases, women in Jammu and Kashmir are feeling deprived of avenues to get justice and other basic rights. Jammu & Kashmir State Commission for Protection of Women

and Child Rights was scrapped soon after the Centre abrogated Article 370 on August 5, 2019 and since then there is no such panel for women where they can register their grievances.

According to the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), experts, activists and NGOs working on gender issues believe that the commission was a substitute to police stations where women hesitate to file their com-

Govt grants 60 day 'Special Maternity Leave' on death of baby after birth or stillbirth

Srinagar, Mar 08: The Jammu & Kashmir government has decided to grant a special maternity leave of 60 days to a woman employee in case of the death of a child soon after the birth or stillbirth with some conditions.

According to a notification in this regard has been issued by Director General Codes, Finance Department, a copy of which lies with the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO), the condition includes that "in case a maternity leave has already been availed by a woman employee and her leave continues till the date of expiry of (a) child soon after birth/stillbirth, the maternity leave already availed till death of the child may be converted into any other kind of leave available CONTINUED ON » PAGE 07

from the date of expiry of a child soon after birth or stillbirth in case the maternity leave has not been availed by a woman employee, the notification reads, adding, "60 days of Special Maternity Leave may be granted from the date of expiry of (a) child after birth/stillsoon birth."As per the notification, the condition for the death of a child soon after birth may be defined as up to 28 days after birth. A baby born with no signs of life at or after 28 weeks of gestation may be defined as stillbirth and the benefit of Special Maternity Leave shall be admissible only to a woman employee with

Moscow: Russian Defence Minister Sergei Shoigu said on Tuesday the capture of the eastern Ukrainian town of Bakhmut was key to launching a further offensive in the wider region.

"This city is an important defensive hub for Ukrainian troops in Donbas," Mr Shoigu said of the industrial east of the

"Capturing it will allow for further offensive operations deep into the defence lines of the Ukrainian armed forces," he told a televised meeting of military officials.

The battle for Bakhmut is now the longest-running and bloodiest of Russia's year-long military intervention in Ukraine, and both sides have doubled down in the fight for its control.

Bakhmut, an industrial town once known for its sparkling wine production and salt mines, had an estimated pre-war population of some 80,000 people

But Ukrainian Deputy Prime Minister Iryna Vereshchuk told regional media on Tuesday that fewer than 4,000 civilians now remain.

"Approximately 38 children, as far as we know, remain in Bakhmut today," Ms Vereshchuk said. Both Moscow and Kyiv said on Tuesday

that the fight was exacting a huge cost in military personnel on the opposing side. Ukrainian military said Moscow's forces were launching attacks on

Bakhmut and its outskirts "despite signif-



Mr Shoigu meanwhile said there was a 'significant increase in losses" among Ukrainian forces during recent fighting for Bakhmut.

Neither side has published official tolls from fighting in the Donetsk region, which Moscow claimed to have annexed into Russia last year

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky announced this week that he had instructed the army to find forces to bolster the

defence of Bakhmut. Analysts says that despite the massive resources being thrown by both sides at the battle. Bakhmut offers little strategic importance in the broader fight.

He cited the example of American Wyandotte breed chicken which costs Rs 50,000 to Rs 60,000 at his farm at Illahibagh Soura. He said the well off people purchase these flocks joyfully to keep them as their pets at home. Mushtaq said there are other international poultry breeds including Silver Partridge Brahma, American silky, Snow White Brahma, Malaysian Serama, Japanese Onagadori, Barbu Bantam and Buff Columbian Brahma available at his farm.

"Currently I have about 200 birds of 20 to 30 different breeds from various countries available at our farm," he

He said that after every two weeks he is changing the breeds on offer as he is importing fresh chickens with different origins to provide more choice for the custom-

Mushtaq said he is satisfied with his farm business.

He said his parents have always encouraged him and his brothers are helping in operating the business.

However, it said married women in the age group 18-49 years who have experienced physical violence during a pregnancy have decreased from 1.3 percent to 1.2 per-

Only 14 percent of the women after experiencing any kind of violence have sought help, however, over 77 percent have neither disclosed nor sought help about the violence they experienced, it added—(KNO)

Srinagar, 8th February: Excoriating recent case of death ple's Party Chief Sheeban Ashai demanded a high level enquiry into alleged case of medical negligence. Ashai in a statement said, "Horrendous death of unborn baby girl at Lal Ded Hospital brings to fore underbelly of decades old neglected medical sector of Jammu And Kashmir. How disgraceful is the fact that pregnant mother was kept in labour room for two days allegedly; where she wasn't attended by any of the senior doctors as per the family. Later on night of second day whe she went into labour her family haplessly ran from pillar to post for a senior doctor only later to find out by means of a CTG that her daughter was dead in the womb. All this happened in LD; despite family informing doctors in advance about patient's history of miscarriage. Later allegedly for hours even after the baby was declared dead in womb; for a C-Section patient's husband Showkat had to beg doctors and it took hours before the patient mother was operated upon again. Ashai expressed resentment over such treatment of patients at a tertiary care facility like Lad Ded. He blamed age old criminal nonchalance and cold hearted administrative approach for current mess of medical health care in Kashmir. Ashai asked Govt to immediately improve doctor to patient ratio and ensure all lacuna in staff strength are bridged at the earliest. He asked administration to come clean on questions pertaining thirty hour long shifts of on duty doctors. Ashai lambasted present regime and advised rather than tom-toming and self advertising present Govt lead by LG must take stock of what is happening on ground in J&K. Worst thing about medical sector in Kashmir are the shocking number of infant deaths. In 2020 alone erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir registered 1345 infant deaths. Jammu Kashmir People's Party on behalf of aggrieved family complained to the Administrative Secretary Health and demanded a scrupulous probe in the particular case". Ashai added that such cases are heart wrenching and demanded that present LG administration must immediately bridge the patient to doctor ratio; upgrade medical infrastructure across Jammu & Kashmir so

Dr.Aziz Hajini was also appointed as Secretary JKAACL. Dr.Aziz Hajini was thrice elected as president of the oldest and largest federation of literary organisations of Kashmir AMK(Adbee Markz Kamraz presently headed by Literary Icon Ameen Bhat-A house hold name in JK). Under the patronage of Dr. Aziz Ha-

jini AMK attained name and fame at all levels in the country.

Buttler sees room for improvement ahead of World Cup defence

CHITTAGONG: Captain Jos Buttler warned his England side they have "areas to improve" ahead of their ODI World Cup defence after failing to seal a series clean sweep in Bangladesh.

England lost the third and final ODI against Bangladesh in Chittagong on Monday by 50 runs, although the tourists had already secured the series. With an eye on the World Cup later this year in In-— where conditions will be similar to Bangladesh — Buttler changed his England side for the final match. The game was England's last scheduled 50-over match until Sept 8. "I think we played some really good cricket throughout the series and I've spoken a lot about these being great conditions for us to challenge ourselves in,"



Buttler said.

"These are probably the conditions that we would find the hardest as a team. "Now there's plenty to learn — things that we've done well and areas that we can also improve," the captain added.

England were set 247 to win in Chittagong but folded for 196 and Buttler said that "we needed someone to go on and really take ownership of that chase". But he had no regrets

about experimenting with his line-up.

'We changed a few things today and gave opportunity to people in different ways, but I thought the intensity was there," he said.

England have some difficult decisions on the make-up of their World Cup squad.

Senior players Joe Root and Jonny Bairstow are both likely to return, while Test skipper Ben Stokes has hinted that he could come out of ODI retirement for England's title defence.

"I think the schedule is
