NEW DELHI, APR 15: Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led regime's policy of zerotolerance towards terrorism has allowed the people of Jammu and Kashmir to breathe freely. They are eagerly waiting to host the G-20 summit in Srinagar and send a message to the world that Pakistansponsored terrorism is on its last leg in the Himalayan region.

India announced Srinagar as the venue for the G20 Tourism Working Group meeting scheduled to take place from May 22 to 24. As of date, the number of active terrorists in J&K has declined to an all-time low with just around 50 terrorists being active in the Himalayan region. It's for the first time since 1990 when Pakistan-

sponsored insurgency broke out in J&K, the number of terrorists has fallen below the 70-mark.

After the abrogation of Article 370--a temporary provision in the Constitution, on August 5, 2019--the security forces have cast a web around the terror ecosystem from all sides. The crackdown on stone-pelters, separatists and terror financers has broken the back of terrorists. Nefarious designs of terrorist handlers sitting across the Line of Control to airdrop weapons and cash through drones have also been thwarted as the security forces are maintaining a tight vigil.

In 2017 there were about 350 terrorists active in the region. In 2023, the number has fallen below 50, top police officials said.

During the past three years, the J&K Police and the central armed forces have managed to control terrorism to a large extent by dismantling the system that sustained Pakistan-sponsored insurgency for nearly three decades.

When Narendra Modi became the Prime Minister of India in 2014, he promised the nation that the regime led by him won't tolerate terrorism. PM Modi has kept his word about zero tolerance to terrorism and has pulled Jammu and Kashmir out of a quagmire of uncertainty and chaos fueled by Pakistan and its stooges in the Himalayan region.

After J&K's transition into a Union Territory and scrapping of Article 370, PM Modi-led dispensation launched a decisive battle against terrorism in the region. Security forces were given clear-cut instructions to act tough against terrorists and their supporters but with a word of caution that innocents shouldn't be touched. During the past three years, terrorists and their supporters have been nailed and no innocent has been harassed. Collateral damage during encounters with the terrorists has been brought down providing much-needed relief to the common people. On the other hand properties of the separatists and a few elements who willfully allowed their houses to be used as terror hideouts have been seized.

Recently, Union Home Minister Amit Shah chaired a meeting in New Delhi to review J&K security. He expressed satisfaction over the lowest-ever count of terrorists in the Union Territory. He directed the security top brass to expedite the efforts to root out remaining terrorists to make peace a permanent feature.

Shah hailed the efforts of police and other security forces for putting in their best to root out terrorism from J&K soil and exuded hope that the number of terrorists in J&K would fall to zero soon.

The Union Home Minister appreciated police, security forces and central agencies, including NIA, working in close coordination with each other to achieve the goal of a terrorism-free Jammu and Kashmir.

Srinagar hosting the G-20 meeting is ample proof of the fact that the people of J&K have rejected Pakistan's propaganda and its agents who sold them illusions like "Azadi". People have rejected violence and embraced peace. They have endorsed all the decisions of the Centre and are moving on the path of prosperity.

It's a great achievement for the people. It's an indication that J&K has shunned the tag of being a terror-hit region marred by violence, street protests, cross-firings and grenade attacks.

Just three years ago, no one would have even thought that Srinagar would host the representatives of the most powerful countries in the world. But the sincere and dedicated efforts put in by the government and the security forces have transformed the "terror capital" of India into the most happening place in the country. Pertinently, when the Centre announced its decision to end the 70-year-old status quo of J&K by scrapping its so-called special status and dividing it into two Union Territories, Kashmir-based politicians went into mourning and predicted that J&K's connection with India has ended. They accused the Centre of burning the bridge (Article 370). They warned that the Union Territory would descend into chaos and eventually fall into the lap of Pakistan. None of their predictions came true. As of date they are acting as fence sitters and are counting the mistakes they made when they were in power. These politicians are aware of the fact that terrorism is about to end, J&K has witnessed massive development and the local youth have said no to guns. But they are refusing to acknowledge it. They are still in denial mode as for them nothing has changed. But everyone knows that they have closed their eyes and don't want to see how the ground situation has improved. Till politicians ruled Jammu and Kashmir they had created an impression that peace could not prevail in the Himalayan region till talks are held with Pakistan and the terrorist leaders supported by it. The zero-tolerance policy towards terrorism followed by the PM Modi-led regime has shattered all the myths. It has been proven beyond doubt that Pakistan-sponsored terrorism in J&K is the mother of all ills and it has to be wiped out to end all the fake narratives that were built during the past three decades. After 2019, stone-pelting, street protests, preaching anti-India narrative and shutdowns have become history. J&K people, especially the denizens of Kashmir, are working around the clock without any fear, threat or intimidation. The gun-wielding terrorists and the separatists, who used to dictate terms, have lost their addresses as the present dispensation in the Centre has cut them to size. People of J&K, especially the valley, have been the biggest beneficiaries. They are reaping the dividends of peace. Tourism season has become a year-long activity and people are eagerly waiting for the G-20 meeting to be held in Srinagar. They are least interested in what Pakistan is saying and the opinions of the politicians, who misled them for 70-long years.

The Prime Minister further called on global institutions to support countries in encouraging behavioural initiatives like Mission LiFE. He also highlighted that adequate financing methods need to be worked out to support such initiatives and urged the World Bank to increase its focus on climate finance. Mr Modi expressed confidence that initiatives like Mission LiFE would have a multiplier effect in the fight against climate change.

In a tweet, World Bank President David Malpass expressed his delight upon hearing about India's LiFE initiative from the Prime Minister. He acknowledged that appropriate pricing policies and institutions when combined with the right incentives, have the potential to alter deeply ingrained habits and contribute towards environmental protection.

5-day wet.....

from Sunday (April 16) to April 20. The weatherman also said that there is possibility of damage to orchards and abrupt fall in day temperature.

Director Meteorological department (MeT), Sonum Lotus told the news agency-Kashmir News Observer (KNO) that a fresh spell of intermittent light to moderate rain and snowfall is expected over higher reaches in J&K during April 16-20.

He said that the main activity will be during April 17-18.

During this wet spell, thunderstorms with strong gusty wind reaching (20-30KMPH) and hailstorm are also possible at some places of Jammu & Kashmir, he said, adding that the wet spell is due to approaching of a fresh Western Disturbance over North India.

In wake of the fresh wet spell, there is a possibility of temporary disruption of surface transportation especially over hilly and snowbound areas.

He further said that the waterlogging in low lying areas and damage to orchards is also possible. Besides, there would be an abrupt fall in day temperature by 7-8 degree Celsius.

He advised people that prior to embark on long journey, confirm road status from concerned traffic department.

"Stay informed about the weather, as it is dynamic. Farmers are advised to postpone spraying of orchards, maintain proper drainage of fields during wet weather," he said.

Lotus further appealed tourists and general public to keep warm clothes ready as cold weather may affect vour health.

"Several more are in the pipeline and we shall be including all tertiary care hospitals and District hospitals where such facilities will be made available," Sudan said.

She said that it is expected to pick up in the future. "In SMHS Srinagar, we have the best response so far. We believe it will pick up once more and more people are made aware about the Scan and Share facility," she said.

"The Committee recommends that there should be a mechanism with the Ministry such as capping of upper and lower prices to stop the practice of 'predatory pricing' or the sudden surge in prices even though price buckets are being created as per international aviation norms, a close watch has to be maintained by the DGCA& the Ministry and a mechanism should be devised to monitor the websites of various airlines to prevent them from misguiding passengers," the panel said that in case private airlines do not publish the correct information regarding fares, they should be penalised for it. "The Committee observes that the Ministry of Civil Aviation has a responsibility to the travelling public and the nation at large to ensure that predatory pricing mechanism are not adopted by the airlines under the cloak of free market economy. The committee recommends the ministry should formulate a pricing mechanism for air fares to ensure that passengers are not charged exorbitant prices,".

The Chamber said that it also likes to impress upon the Airlines operating Delhi/Jammu/Srinagar route to operate additional flights to meet the growing travel to Srinagar.

According to a circular, the Waqf Board has issued the instructions for daily, monthly and annual timetable and schedule of activities to be undertaken by the schools.

As per the circular daily timetable shall have 6 periods (time slots) of 30 minutes each for teaching subjects. "05 periods for compulsory subjects, like English, Maths, Science, Social Science and Urdu and 6th period to be utilized for teaching of optional subjects, like Computers, Kashmiri, Arabic, Islamiyat, Sufi Saints Literature; on rotational basis."

It reads schools should have compulsorily one hour reserved every day for Extra-curricular Activities, that shall be split into two parts of 30 minutes each in the first and second half of the dav.

It reads house system to be established in every school for intra-school co-curricular and sports Competitions.

"To inculcate a sense of belongingness & healthy competition among students, all the school heads are instructed to divide the students into four houses: senior boys, senior girls, junior Boys and junior Girls, on the names of following famous Sufi Saints Hazrat Sheikh Noor-ud-din Noorani (R.A), Hazrat Sheikh Abdul Qadir Jeelani (R.A), Hazrat Sheikh Hamzah Makhdoom (R.A) and Hazrat Shah-e-Hamadan(R.A)

It added sports calendar for the year shall include competitions in sports activities. "Similarly, competitions shall also be held round the year in co-curricular activities. Three days in a month shall be reserved completely for sports & co-curricular competitions. No Academic activities shall be carried out on those days."

It reads school authorities shall allocate at least one period of thirty minutes per month for the House Meetings, so that the House Committee Members can interact, motivate and plan the house activities under guidance of respective House Masters.

"As per government guidelines, testing rate has been increased and all patients having symptoms of influenza and acute respiratory distress are being tested and cases are on rise but hospitalization is not much." e added.

He said that there is no need to panic as the situation is being monitored closely and appropriate steps will be taken in time as the administration has been very successful in managing the previous waves of Covid-19. Despite the low hospitalization rate, everything has been put on alert and facilities are being enhanced so as to tackle any situation, he said.

While replying to a query, he said that there are proper norms under Indian Public Health Standards (IPHS) to decide at what kind of facility should be and population is the main basis to decide whether there is need for a sub center, CHC Or any other health Institute.

These things are being monitored closely and upgradation decisions are being taken accordingly on the basis of IPHS not on the basis of any individual, he said. While replying to another query, he said vacancies are being identified regularly and after long time DPCs were done due to which new positions have gone vacant and recently we have identified around 3000 vacancies that are being regularly referred to recruitment agen-

Ramadan: People serve Iftaar to travelers, passersby to 'earn great rewards' from the Almighty

SRINAGAR, APR 15: As serving Iftaar to a Muslim is considered a highly-rewarding act in Islam, Muhammad Ramzan from central Kashmir's Srinagar district ensures he never misses carrying out the good deed in the holy month of Ramadan.

The 52-year-old, after every Asr (later afternoon) prayer along with his family members, prepares hundreds of Iftaar kits and serves them to the travelers and passersby on the Srinagar-Baramulla highway at the time of breaking the fast. Muslims fast from pre-dawn to dusk in the month of Ramadan.

"It is a routine for me in the month of Ramadan to serve Iftaar to anyone traveling on the highway. A few minutes before Iftaar time, I start distributing Iftaar kits to passersby on the road," Ramzan told the news agency



- Kashmir News Observer (KNO). For him, serving Iftaar is the "happiest and most peaceful moment" for which he spends money from his own earnings. "Serving Iftaar to a fellow Muslim has a great reward from the Almighty," Ramzan said.

Normally, an Iftaar kit consists of a couple of dates, a mineral water bottle, a banana, muskmelon, watermelon, grapes, slices of other fruits, etc. It can also be a cooked rice packet, locally known as biryani, and other delicious eatables.

Another person, Nazir Ahmad, also

has a practice of serving Iftaar, however, not daily but weekly. He serves a glass of 'Babri Byol Treish' (milk mixed with basil seeds) or with the fruit chat.

I prepare around 200 fruit chaat kits and 150 to 175 liters of 'Babri Byol Treish' for Iftaar distribution.

Another neighbour Ramzan, a 33-year-old Nisar Ahmad also serves Iftaar to travelers on the highway.

"Every Ramadan, Iensure that I make the arrangement of Iftaar for those who are traveling on the highway. I make around two buckets of milk mixed with basil seeds and use disposable glasses for distribution," he said.

The scenes are not just confined to a single area of Srinagar but many people from across the valley offer Iftaar to passersby. As the holy month of Ramadan has entered its last phase, more people would make Iftaar arrangements for people.

Ganderbal farmers urge admin to start desilting Jinder irrigation canal

EDITORIAL **Electrocution Concerns in the** Valley....

Electrocution, a fatal consequence of electrical shock, has been on the rise in Kashmir, posing a severe threat to human life. Despite the alarming number of electrocution cases, the government seems to be indifferent to the issue. The situation is a clear indication of the government's disregard for public safety, which needs immediate attention.

The valley has witnessed an alarming number of electrocution deaths in recent times. In the year 2021 alone, over 70 deaths have been reported due to electrocution, and the numbers are still rising. Most of these deaths are caused by the low-hanging live wires, which are a common sight in the valley. The wires are often left unattended, and the concerned authorities seem to be least bothered about the safety of the public.

In a recent tragic incident, a BSNL employee died after he was electrocuted while performing his duties in north Kashmir's Baramulla district. The 48-year-old old employee received an electric shock when he was repairing a wire in the Pattan area.

The lack of access to safety kits, shock-proof jackets, and gloves from authorities to those involved in repairing high-tension wires, might save a number of lives but unfortunately, none of these are being provided to these officials who have to get the job done manually on an emergency basis as being one of the essential services.

The lack of action on the government's part has resulted in a growing sense of fear and anxiety among the citizens. They fear for the safety of their children, who are often seen playing near the poles with live wires hanging from them. Despite several pleas to the authorities, no action has been taken to address the issue. The situation is dire, and the government's inaction has only added to the problem.

One of the major reasons behind the government's indifference toward the issue is the lack of accountability. The officials are responsible for ensuring public safety often turn a blind eye to the issue and fail to take necessary action. In some cases, the officials responsible for maintaining the electricity infrastructure are involved in corruption, which has resulted in the use of sub-standard material, posing a grave danger to human life. The situation is worsened by the lack of awareness among the public. Most people are unaware of the precautions they need to take to avoid electrocution. This ignorance has resulted in a large number of accidents, many of which have proved to be fatal. The government needs to take the initiative to create awareness among the masses and educate them about the precautions they need to take to avoid such accidents. The government must take immediate action to address the issue of electrocution in the valley. They must hold the officials responsible for maintaining the electricity infrastructure accountable and ensure that they use only high-quality materials to avoid such accidents. They must also take necessary action to remove the low-hanging live wires and ensure that the electricity infrastructure is regularly maintained. Moreover, the government must invest in creating awareness among the masses. They must launch a campaign to educate the public about the precautions they need to take to avoid electrocution. The campaign must be conducted in the local language and must be made accessible to everyone. In conclusion, the rise in the number of electrocution cases in Kashmir is a cause of concern. The government's indifference towards the issue is alarming and needs immediate attention. The government must take necessary action to address the issue and ensure the safety of the public. It is time for the government to be accountable for its actions and take necessary measures to prevent such accidents in the future.

Knowledge of technical textiles to skill students in diversified areas



The UGC has directed the institutions imparting textile education to develop a curriculum for technical textiles. This directive has been issued as part of the National Textiles Mission, an initiative by Ministry of Textiles which aims to promote the technical textiles sector. The Textile Ministry has also issued 'General guidelines for enabling of academic institutes in Technical Textiles'. The ministry will fund the HEIs to upgrade the labs and train the faculty to teach the subject. New courses on technical textiles will help students to boost their productivity in textiles industry, increase exports and sustainability.

Increasing demand

Technical textiles are engineered products with a definite functionality, which finds its use in industries such as automobiles, construction, healthcare, and geotextiles and more. In addition to this, there also exists a domain of smart textiles and such textile material can be used to make clothes that get adjusted as per the environmental and climatic conditions. Smart textiles can be used in designing the special clothing for the army personnel deployed in adverse climatic zones. As part of pursuing a course on technical textiles, students would be introduced to the concept of geotextiles. This type of textile material is used in providing the proper layering to roads which is essential to prevent the water seepage. The institutes will introduce short courses offering credit of 1-2, at the UG and PG level. Engineering, Design, and Fashion Technology students are eligible for the courses.



Offering practical training

As per reports, the government has allotted a financial outlay of Rs, 1,480 crore for 2020-21 to 2023 -24 academic session to implement the National Textiles Mission. The course is being introduced with the aim to promote technical textiles. The government has announced four components -Research, Innovation and Development; Promotion and Market Development; Export Promotion and Education Training, and Skill Development, under education, training and skill development measures for promotion of technical textiles.

Speaking to Education Times, SR Shah, head, department of Textile Chemistry, Maharaja Sayajirao University, Vadodara, says, "We would modify the existing curriculum of textile streams and include the concepts of technical textiles for textile processing

technology and other functional textile courses. In addition to this, we are in the process of starting short-term courses on technical textiles once they get approval from the governing body of our university," says Shah. "The curriculum for these short-term courses would be decided by the expert committee of our department," he adds. The chemical modification of textile eventually enhances its usability. For instance, if cotton produced genetically acquires antimicrobial and absorbency properties, it becomes usable in the healthcare sector. The aim is to equip the students in chemical processing to increase the utility.

"Textile Engineering and Chemical textile students will have to study 60% theory and 40% of practical work, based on the revised curriculum," adds Shah. Gujarat and several other southern states are a hub of textile industries. The new courses in the textile sector will boost productivity and sustainability by skilling the students.

Elangovan N, former director, NIFT Kannur (Kerala), says, "There is an urgent need to develop the curricula relating to technical textiles in the institutes that are located around the textile hubs of the country as students residing in these areas need to be skilled in this domain. It is also essential to upskill students in this emerging domain as the industry needs technically skilled manpower. The technical textiles should have been in focus much earlier. Students also need to be motivated to pursue courses related to technical textiles as it is an emerging field."



The Ministry said, 397 vaccine doses of COVID have been administered during the last 24 hours under the nationwide vaccination drive. Around 220.66 cr Total Vaccine doses (95.21 cr Second Dose and 22.87 cr Precaution Dose) have been administered so far under Nationwide Vaccination Drive, said the Ministry. Meanwhile, 92.38 cr Total Tests conducted so far; 1,58,625 tests conducted in the last 24, as per Ministry data.

Special Delhi Assembly Session On Monday After CBI Summons Arvind Kejriwal

New Delhi: The Arvind Kejriwal government has called a special session of the assembly on Monday to discuss the Central Bureau of Investigation's summons to the Chief Minister in the liquor policy case.

Mr Kejriwal's deputy Manish Sisodia is already in jail for alleged corruption in framing the liquor policy case, which was scrapped later.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government has alleged the centre has weaponised the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and the Enforcement Directorate (ED) to go after opposition leaders with false cases.

"The situation is not good. It should be discussed in the assembly. Leaders of the Delhi government will speak about what is going on," AAP MLA and minister Saurabh Bharadwaj told reporters today.

Mr Kejriwal, who has been summoned tomorrow by the CBI, has threatened to file a case against both the CBI and the ED for alleged perjury by filing false affidavits in courts. "We will file appropriate cases

against CBI and ED officials for perjury and producing false evidence in courts," Mr Kejriwal tweeted. Law



Minister Kiren Rijiju, responding to Mr Kejriwal's tweet, took a swipe at the Delhi Chief Minister over his threat.

"Forgot to mention that you will file case against the court also if it convicts you? Let the law take its own course and we must believe in rule of law. Will you go to court against ED, CBI and if the court also goes against you, then will you go against the court too?" Mr Rijiju tweeted. Indians In Sudan Asked To Stay Indoors Amid Army-Paramilitary Clash

Khartoum, Sudan: Indians in Sudan have been asked to take shelter by the country's mission in the African nation following explosions and gunfire in the capital city as paramilitaries and the regular army traded attacks on each other's bases.

"In view of reported firings and clashes, all Indians are advised to take utmost precautions, stay indoors and stop venturing outside with immediate effect. Please also stay calm and wait for updates," a tweet from the Indian Embassy in Khartoum read. Violence flared in Sudan on Saturday after weeks of deepening tensions between military leader Abdel Fattah al-Burhan and his number two, paramilitary commander Mohamed Hamdan Daglo, over the planned integration of the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) into the regular army.

Witnesses reported "confrontations" and loud explosions and gunfire near an RSF base in south Khartoum.

The RSF said its forces had taken control of Khartoum airport after witnesses reported seeing truckloads of fighters entering the airport compound.

Gunfire was heard near the airport, as well as near Burhan's residence and in Khartoum North. Civilians were seen running for cover as artillery exchanges rocked the streets, news agency AFP reported.

The two sides traded blame for starting the fighting.

"The Rapid Support Forces were surprised Saturday with a large force from the army entering camps in Soba in Khartoum and laying siege to paramilitaries there," it said in a statement.

It said a "sweeping attack with all kinds of heavy and light weapons" was underway.

The RSF said its fighters had also taken control of the airport in Merowe, north of Khartoum.

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida was evacuated unhurt after a suspect threw what appeared to be a smoke bomb at an outdoor speech in western Japan on Saturday, domestic media reported.

A loud explosion was heard, but the premier took cover and was unharmed while police subdued a man at the scene, public broadcaster NHK said.

The incident occurred at the Saikazaki fishing harbour in Wakayama prefecture, some 65 km(40 miles) southwest of Osaka city.

Former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, the longest-serving leader of modern Japan, was assassinated with a homemade gun last July while campaigning for a parliamentary election, shocking the nation and prompting a review of security for politicians, who routinely press the flesh with the public.

China voices 'concern' over Taliban policies on women rights

hinese Foreign Minister Qin Gang said his country is "concerned" about the impact of recent policies introduced by Afghanistan's Taliban government on the rights of women, state media reported on Friday.

Qin's comments at a regional summit in Samarkand, Uzbekistan, come after a decision by the conservative Taliban authorities to bar women from working for the United Nations sparked international outrage.

"China and other friendly neighbours of Afghanistan are concerned about the recent policies and measures taken by the Afghan side and their possible impact on the basic rights and interests of Afghan women," Qin told reporters on Thursday, according to the official Xinhua news agency.

But the foreign minister added that while the issue of women's rights and interests is very important, "it is not the whole issue of Afghanistan, nor is it the core or root cause of Afghanistan's problems". "We should neither turn a blind eye to this problem nor ignore it," he said.

Taliban authorities have imposed a slew of restrictions on Afghan women since seizing power in 2021.

Taliban officials have argued that their extension of curbs on female employment to include the UN's operations in the country.

UK Imposes Export Bar On Painting Of Indian Soldiers During World War I

London: A portrait by Anglo-Hungarian painter Philip de Laszlo of two Indian soldiers who fought in World War I was placed under a temporary export bar by the British government to allow time for a UK institution to acquire the "wonderful and sensitive" work to prevent it leaving the country.

The unfinished portrait, valued at around GBP 650,000, depicts cavalry officers Risaldar Jagat Singh and Risaldar Man Singh junior troop commanders in the British Indian Army's Expeditionary Force who served at the Battle of the Somme in France and presumed to have died in action.

The painting is extremely rare in depicting active Indian participants in the First World War. "This wonderful and sensitive portrait captures an important moment in our history as soldiers were drawn from across the globe to help fight in the trenches of the First World War," said Lord Stephen Parkinson, UK Arts and Heritage Minister. "I hope this magnificent painting can remain in the UK to help tell the story of those brave soldiers and the contribution they and so many others made to Allied victory," he said. Around 1.5 million Indian soldiers were deployed during World War I and according to records, the two soldiers in the painting sat for the artist in London two months before being sent to France to fight in the trenches.

Sudanese paramilitary force claims control of Khartoum airport amid clashes with army

Sudan's paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) said on Saturday that it had taken control of Khartoum international airport, as clashes erupted with the army.

Gunfire could be heard in several parts of Khartoum and eyewitnesses said gunfire was also heard in adjoining cities.

A Reuters journalist saw cannons and armoured vehicles deployed in the streets and heard the sound of heavy weapons fire in the vicinity of the headquarters of both the army and RSF.The RSF said in a statement it had been able to take control of Khartoum international airport in the capital and the Merowe military base in the north of the country.

On Saturday there was a heavy exchange of gunfire in Merowe, eyewitnesses told Reuters. A statement by the RSF on Saturday called the army's actions a "brute assault" and called for it to be condemned. It said that the RSF had been in contact with local and international mediators to inform them.Earlier, the RSF said the army had surrounded one of its bases and opened fire with heavy weapons.

Death toll from Myanmar junta's strike on village rises to 171

BANGKOK: The death toll from an air strike on a central Myanmar village rose to an estimated 171 victims on Friday, according to a team member involved in cremating bodies and media reports.

Myanmar has been in crisis since the military toppled Aung San Suu Kyi's civilian government in a February 2021 coup, with an estimated 3,200 civilians killed as part of the junta's crackdown on dissent.

There was no official death toll from Tuesday morning's strike on Pazi Gyi village in the central Sagaing region, although military authorities confirmed they had carried out an operation in the area.

A villager involved in cremating the bodies, who asked not to be identified to protect his safety, said on Friday his team had revised its death count up to 171 from 130 a day earlier. He told AFP 109 men, 24 women and 38 children were killed. Another 53 wounded were receiving medical care, he said.

Myanmar's National Unity Government, a shadow body dominated by former lawmakers from Suu Kyi's party, tweeted a chart on Friday with a total of 168 fatalities.

Pazi Gyi was deserted on Friday, with villagers too scared to return.

The attack drew international outrage with the UK calling the UN Security Council to meet to discuss the incident. The Association of Southeast Asian Nations strongly condemned the air strikes.

The junta confirmed on Wednesday it had launched "limited" air strikes in the area and blamed some of the deaths on mines planted by anti-junta fighters.

NEWS In Conversation: How diet may help with endometriosis

Torldwide, millions of people who menstruate have endometriosis, a gynecological condition that can cause debilitating symptoms and severely impact a person's



quality of life, mental health, and productivity. Yet treatments for endometriosis remain limited, and many people continue to struggle with symptom management. Could dietary interventions help? Endometriosis is a gynecological condition in which endometrial-type tissue - similar to the tissue lining the inside of the uterus – grows in other parts of the body

While endometrial-like tissue most commonly affectsTrusted Source other organs in the pelvic and abdominal areas - such as the fallopian tubes, bladder, and intestines - research shows that in some cases it is much more far-reaching, impacting the heart, lungs, and even brain. Some research suggests that endometriosis can affect every single organ in the human body.

This condition can cause long menstrual periods (longer than 7 days), heavy bleeding, excruciatingly painful cramps that may cause a person to faint, nausea and vomiting, pain during and after sex with vaginal penetration, fatigue, and spotting between periods, among several other symptoms.

For people who receive a diagnosis of endometriosis, there are relatively few treatment and management options, which are not effective for everyone, and which do not guarantee long-term relief even for those for whom they do work.

This has led medical doctors, researchers, and individuals with endometriosis alike to search for additional relief methods, and one of these is centered on nutrition.

In this month's installment of the In Conversation podcast, we discuss why endometriosis can be so difficult to manage, and some of the ways in which dietary changes may help relieve symptoms such as pain and heavy bleeding. Our guests are Dr. Hana Kahleova and Hannah Alderson.

Dr. Kahleova is director of clinical research at the Physicians Committee for Responsible Medicine – a nonprofit organization headquartered in Washington, DC - and one of the authors of a recent review looking at nutrition as a factor in the risk for and management of endometriosis. The review appeared in the journal Frontiers in Nutrition in February 2023. Alderson is a registered nutritionist with the Brit-

However, some have a high sugar content and may cause digestive issues like bloating and gas.

Research on the health benefits of probiotics and prebiotics is limited.

What's the first drink you reach for when you're thirsty?

For many people, it's a can of soda. But if you're looking for a healthy swap, you could soon be replacing your usual beverage with a soda that claims to have added benefits.

Recently, prebiotic and probiotic sodas have been gaining popularity, thanks in part to reviews on TikTok.

In fact, search 'probiotic soda' on the social media platform, and you'll get 119m results, with many users reviewing popular gut-health sodas from brands like Poppi, Olipop, and Culture Pop.

These fizzy and sweet drinks are said to have less sugar than conventional sodas and are made with ingredients believed to support a healthier gut.

What is the difference between prebiotics and probiotics?

To put it simply, probiotics are live microorganisms, usually bacteria, that live in our gut and keep it balanced and healthy.

Prebiotics are a type of fiber that we can't digest. They serve as food for the probiotics, helping them grow and flourish in our gut.

Probiotics and prebiotics work together to keep our digestive system healthy and balanced, so are there any benefits to consuming them in a soda? Why the interest in probiotic and

prebiotic sodas is growing Marilia Chamon, registered nutri-



tional therapist, gut health expert, and founder of Gutfulness Nutrition, isn't surprised that prebiotic and probiotic beverages are taking off. She says their newfound popularity is the result of several factors.

Firstly, people are becoming more

aware of the importance of gut health. "Increasing awareness of gut health and the role of the gut microbiome in overall well-being has driven interest in products that claim to support gut health," Chamon surmises.

Secondly, she says the appeal of

these sodas is rooted in convenience.

"As a beverage, they provide a tasty way to incorporate beneficial microbes and dietary fibers into one's routine, making them an attractive option for consumers who want to improve their gut health without making significant dietary changes," she explains.

Are these sodas really good for your gut?

While a growing number of people are reaching for these drinks as a healthier alternative to traditional sodas, are they actually beneficial for your gut and overall health?

Chamon isn't entirely convinced.

"I personally can't see much benefit to it, apart from increased fiber intake," she says. "If you eat a western diet, based mostly on refined sugars and carbohydrates, and a high intake of animal proteins and saturated fat with little consumption of whole foods, prebiotic sodas can contribute to your daily recommended fiber intake," she explains.

"However, I would rather people focus on improving their dietary patterns instead of relying on prebiotic sodas to support their health goals," she added.

While Chamon says these sodas can be a convenient and enjoyable way to incorporate dietary fiber into one's daily routine, she believes they should not replace a diet rich in whole foods; one that includes:

- fruits
- vegetables
- whole grains
- legumes
- nuts and seeds

Chamon says the main question to ask is, "What are you taking probiotics for?"

"Probiotics are strain-dependent and different strains offer different health benefits. Ideally, you should be looking for a strain that has been studied and proven to help with the specific symptom you are looking to address," she explains.
