

### **CAA Will Never Be** Taken Back", Amit Shah Makes **Categorical Statement**

NEW DELHI, MAR 14: Days after the central government notified the Citizenship Amendment Act, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said that the law will



never be taken back and the BJP-led government will

never compromise with it.

In an interview to news agency, Amit Shah said, "This is our sovereign right to ensure Indian citizenship in our country, we will never compromise on it and CAA will never be taken back."

Asked about the opposition INDIA bloc, specifically a Congress leader stating that they would repeal the law when they will come to power, the Home Minister said that even the opposition is aware it has bleak chances of coming to power.

"Even INDI alliance knows that it will not come

Modi said the PM SVANidhi scheme has been a big boost to the lakhs of families of street vendors who were never paid any "attention" by previous governments. They used to suffer insults and ran from pillar to post as they hardly got loans from banks and had to obtain capital at exorbitant interest rates, he said.

"Modi ki guarantee" has ensured that they can get loans from banks at simple rates," he said.

Over 62 lakh persons have been given loans of about Rs 11,000 crore, he said.

The BJP government at the Centre has been working to improve the lives of the poor and middle class in the national capital, he said, adding that it has been making honest efforts to ease traffic and curb pollution in Indian cities.

Meteorological Centre Srinagar said, "the weather will generally remain dry till March 20, while a fresh Western disturbance may trigger a fresh spell of rain and snowfall at many places from March 22 to

Kashmir plains were lashed by light to moderate rains, while some upper reaches, including tourist spots in Gulmarg Pahalgam, and Sonamarg, received a fresh spell of snowfall during the past 24 hours.

The MeT office said Srinagar received 9.1mm of rainfall, Qazigund 24.6mm, Pahalgam 15.6mm of rainfall and 3.0cm of snowfall, Kupwara 14.9mm of rainfall, Kokernag 18.9mm, and Gulmarg 24,2mm of rainfall and 22.0cm of snowfall during the past 24 hours.

The night temperature at all stations in the Kashmir Valley was recorded below normal, while the day temperature also slipped down due to rain and snowfall. Srinagar recorded a maximum temperature below 2.1°C against the normal of

14.7°C the previous day. Srinagar witnessed a drop in the night temperature recorded at a low of 4.4°C during the intervening nights of Wednesday and Thursday against the 5.4°C recorded the previous night. However, it was 0.7°C above normal for the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir.

Qazigund on the Srinagar-Jammu national highway in south Kashmir recorded a low of 1.8°C against the 3.4°C, while the picnic spot of Kokernag plunged to 1.3°C against the 4.2°C recorded the previous night.

The night temperature at Pahalgam dropped to -1.3°C from -0.5°C a day ago. It was 0.1°C below normal for the famous tourist hot spot of south Kashmir.

The temperature at the ski resort of Gulmarg slipped down to -4.8°C from -1.2°C the previous night. It was 1.5°C below normal for the valley of meadows in north Kashmir's Baramulla district on Thursday.

Kupwara had a low of 1.2°C against 4.5°C the previous night. It was 1.1°C below normal for the frontier Kashmir district on Thursday, the MeT office said. (UNI)

An avalanche with "medium danger" level is likely to occur above 2400 metres over Doda, Kishtwar, Poonch and Ramban districts in Jammu division in the next 24

A similar warning has also been issued for the people living above 2400 metres in Kupwara, Bandipora, Ganderbal and Baramulla districts of Kashmir valley during the next 24 hours.

People living in these areas have been advised to take precautions and avoid venturing in the avalanche prone areas till further orders.

country, the huge consignments of drugs like Heroine and Brown Sugar are coming from the neighbouring country."

"There was only a challenge of homegrown cannabis and involvement was limited in the recent past but, now the involvement is more as heroin and brown sugar is pushed into this side in a large quantity," said the police chief.

"This was the case with Punjab and now it is growing here as well but we will not allow J&K to become Punjab," he said.

He also said that there are 10 drug de-addiction centres of Police operating at present and some private players also

"The centers are less compared to the number of addicts. Police will assess where it stands at present and where it would stand in 2025," he stated.

He also added that while on one hand police will crack whip on dealers and suppliers by resorting to seizure of properties under UAPA, on the other hand, there is a need to address the issue of demand as well and those demanding the drugs.

"For us the addict is a victim," he said, adding that dealing with the growing narcotics business in J&K is a tough job but police is committed to handle it.

into power. CAA has been brought by the BJP party, and the Narendra Modi-led government has brought it. It is impossible to repeal it. We will spread awareness about it in the whole nation so that those

who want to repeal it do not get a place,"

The union minister also dismissed criticism that the "CAA is unconstitutional" stating that it does not violate the constitutional provisions.

"They always talk about Article 14. They forget that there are two clauses in that Article. This law does not violate Article 14. There is a clear, reasonable classification here. This is a law for those who, due to partition, remained in Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Bangladesh and were facing religious persecution and decided to come to India," the Union Minister said.

Replying to the Opposition's claim of the timing of bringing notification of CAA before the Lok Sabha elections, Amit Shah said, "First of all I will talk about the timing. All opposition parties including Rahul Gandhi, Mamata or Kejriwal are indulging in jhooth ki rajneeti (politics of lies) so the question of timing does not arise. BJP has made it clear in its 2019 manifesto that it will bring CAA and provide Indian citizenship to refugees (from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan). BJP has a clear agenda and under that promise, the Citizenship (Amendment) Bill was passed in both houses of Parliament in 2019. It got delayed due to Covid. BJP had cleared its agenda well before the party got its mandate in the polls."

"Rules are now a formality. There is no question of timing, political gain or loss. Now, the Opposition wants to consolidate their vote bank by doing appeasement politics. I want to request them that they have been exposed. CAA is the law for the entire country and I have reiterated nearly 41 times in four years that it will become a reality," he said.

The Home Minister said that there is "no question of political gain as the main aim of the BJP is to provide rights and justice to persecuted minorities coming from Pakistan, Afghanistan and Bangladesh.

"The opposition had even raised questions on surgical strike and the abrogation of Article 370 and linked it with political gain. So should we not take stern steps against terrorism? We have been saying since 1950 that we will withdraw Article 370" the Home Minister said.

"I have spoken on CAA at least 41 times on different platforms and spoken on it in detail that the minorities of the country need not be afraid because it has no provision to take back the rights of any citizen. The CAA aims to confer Indian citizenship to persecuted non-Muslim migrants-including Hindus, Sikhs, Jains, Buddhists, Parsis, and Christians-who migrated from Bangladesh, Pakistan, and Afghanistan and arrived in India before December 31, 2014, and through this law, their sufferings can be ended" he added.

The Home Minister was critical of opposition leaders like AIMIM's Asaddudin Owaisi and West Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee for claiming that the CAA was

anti-Muslim. "You cannot see this law in isolation. On August 15, 1947, our country was partitioned. Our country was partitioned into three parts; this is the background. Bharatiya Jan Sangh and BJP were always against the Partition. We never wanted that country to be partitioned based on

religion," he said. "So when the country was partitioned on the basis of religion, minorities faced persecution, they were being converted, women in the minority section were being tortured and came to India. They came to our refuge; don't they have a right to get our citizenship? Even Congress leaders during the partition in their speeches said that those minorities should stay wherever they are due to the widespread bloodshed and they will be welcomed later in our country. Now they started doing vote bank politics and due to appeasement," Shah added.

The Home Minister said that it was the moral duty of the government to ensure the rights of those who were persecuted.

"The people who were part of Akhand Bharat and who were prosecuted or tortured those people should be given refuge in India and this is our social and Constitutional responsibility. Now if you look closely at the statistics, in Pakistan when the partition happened there were 23 per cent Hindus and Sikhs but now only 3.7 per cent of Hindus and Sikhs are left. where are they? They have not returned here. They were converted, tortured, and insulted they were given second-class status. Where will they go? Will the country will not think, Parliament will not think about them, and the political parties should not think about them?" the Home

"In Afghanistan, at the moment there are now only about 500 Hindus...don't these people have right to live as per their beliefs. When Bharat was one, they were our brothers," he added.

Slamming Delhi's Chief Minister for his remarks that CAA will take away jobs meant for India's youth, and can lead to an increase in crime, the Union Minister said that people who will benefit from the law are already in India.

"If they are so concerned why are they not talking about Bangladeshi infiltrators and Rohingyas because they are doing vote bank politics? Delhi elections are tough for them that's why they are indulging in vote bank politics" he said.

Amit Shah also questioned West Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee for alleging that citizenship of minorities would be taken away due to the CAA.

"I am requesting Mamata ji, that there are several platforms to do politics, but please don't harm Bengali Hindus coming from Bangaldesh. I challenge Mamata publically to tell one such clause that has the provision of taking away citizenship of any Indian. Her intention is to create differences between Hindus and Muslims to consolidate vote bank. CAA has to be done. If she wants to anything stop infiltration, but she is not cooperating" Amit Shah said.

The CAA, introduced by the Narendra Modi government and passed by Parliament in 2019, aims to confer Indian citizenship to persecuted non-Muslim migrants-including Hindus, Sikhs, Jains, Buddhists, Parsis, and Christians-who migrated from Bangladesh, Pakistan, and Afghanistan and arrived in India before December 31, 2014. The case related to the financial fraud committed with J&K State Co-operative Bank (JKSTCB) by fraudulent sanctioning and disbursement of a loan to the tune of Rs. 223 Crore in 2019 to a fictitious cooperative society named River Jehlum Co-operative House Building Society, Shivpora. Srinagar, by the then Chairman of JKSTCB & Others.

Officials said the ED initiated an investigation based on an FIR and consequent charge sheets filed by the law enforcement agency of Srinagar against five accused - Dar, Hajam, Hilal Ahmed Mir, the Chairman of the River Jhelum Cooperative House Building Society, Mohammad Mujeeb Ur Rehman Ghassi (the then registrar of Cooperative Societies, J&K) and Syed Ashiq Hussain (the then deputy registrar of Cooperative Societies, J&K).

The spokesman said ED initiated an investigation based on FIR and consequent chargesheets filed by the law enforcement agency, Srinagar invoking various sections of Ranbir Penal Code (RPC) & Jammu & Kashmir Prevention of Corruption Act (JK PC Act) Samvat 2006 (Corresponding to IPC and PCA) against the five accused

ED investigation revealed that five accused in connivance with one another had managed to fraudulently receive the sanction of the loan of Rs.250 Crore from JKSTCB in the name of a "fake society", River Jhelum Co-operative House Building Society and siphoned off the same as payments made towards the purchase of land parcels, without any collateral security and ignoring all the regulatory procedures in a criminal conspiracy relating to offence of money laundering under Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

This is the second provisional attachment in this case.

Earlier, immovable properties valued at Rs. 193.46 Crore were also provisionally attached in December 2023. Also, in January this year, Prosecution under PMLA has been launched against six persons including the aforesaid accused before PMLA Court, Srinagar, which has taken cognizance of the same.

Further investigation in the matter is ongoing, ED said. (UNI)

### Centre sets up tribunal to adjudicate ban on Jamaat-e-Islami in J&K

NEW DELHI, MAR 14: The Centre has consti $tuted\,a\,Tribunal\,comprising\,a\,Delhi\,high\,court\,judge$ to adjudicate whether or not there is sufficient cause for declaring the Jamaat-e-Islami, Jammu and Kashmir as an unlawful association.

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) issued a notification in this regard on Wednesday.

"Jamaat-e-Islami has been declared as an unlawful association, vide notification dated February 27, 2024, published in the Gazette of India, Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 5 read with sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 (37 of 1967), the Central Government hereby constitutes the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Tribunal consisting of Justice Navin Chawla, Judge, High Court of Delhi, for the purpose of adjudicating whether or not there is sufficient cause for declaring it as unlawful association," reads the notification.

On February 27 this year, the Centre extended ban on Jamaat-e-Islami for another five years. Jel was earlier banned on February 28, 2019.

### Over 800 fire incidents in Kashmir Valley this year, 180 in Srinagar

SRINAGAR, MAR 14: With over eight hundred fire incidents reported across Kashmir Valley this year till date, people are requested to be cautious and check their wiring to prevent any short-circuit that may lead to a fire incident, a top officer of the Fire & Emergency Services Department said.

He said around 180 incidents have been reported in the Srinagar district alone, and people should follow Dos and Don'ts to prevent any further fire incidents.

Speaking with the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Er Agib Hussain, Deputy Director of Fire & Emergency Services (F&ES), said Srinagar district alone has witnessed around 180 fire incidents this year, contributing much to the overall count of 800 incidents reported across the valley. He said two deaths and two injuries were reported in these incidents. "In winter, people use many heating gadgets. We should stay cautious and follow Dos and Don'ts," he said.

The officer said many fire incidents happen with short circuits and breakage of wiring. He urged people to conduct regular electrical audits and install protective measures such as MCBs (Miniature Circuit Breakers) to safeguard against potential fire hazards.

Hussain urged people to maintain contact information for their nearest fire stations and familiarise themselves with emergency protocols. Those who don't have such contacts can use the helpline number 101.

## SMC installs old, defective street lights, claim Srinagar people

**SRINAGAR, MAR 14:** People from different areas of Srinagar city have been claiming that Srinagar Municipal Corporation has been installing defective and old

SMC these days has been installing street lights. These lights have already been installed in Hamdania Colony Bemina, Gangbo, and Gulberg Colony Hyderpora.

Inhabitants of several localities alleged that after inspecting these street lights, it seems these are old, and defective without lights are always packed but the men who install them get all the lights without any packing," they

The aggrieved people told the news agency Kashmir News Trust that they managed to click the photographs of these street lights and they intend to show them to the people at the helm of affairs.

"You won't believe, outside the residence of an official, a new street light, properly packed was installed while at other places, the same old street lights were used. It seems these lights had any packing. "The new street been stored in a room with flood



water," they said.

The conscious citizens said

that SMC started the installation process under phase 2 on 26 January this year and it halted the work on 7 February when various people complained that defective and old lights were being installed. "Now SMC has again started the installation process after some break, but again same old, defective lights are being installed," they said.

They appealed to Commissioner SMC to look into the matter and ensure that sophisticated lights be installed in the streets and on the roads of Srinagar city.

### **Only 5-6% of kidney transplant patients able** to access surgery, says noted urologist

Dr Salim Wani calls for early detection, healthy lifestyle habits

SRINAGAR, MAR 14: Among around one lakh patients requiring kidney transplants, just around five to six percent of lucky people have access to it, said Dr Salim Wani, a prominent urologist in Kashmir.

Speaking with the news agency— Kashmir News Observer (KNO), Dr Wani said there are limited options available once kidney failure occurs, with dialysis and transplantation being the primary treatments. However, he said that in India, only about 5,000 to 6,000 people out of the one lakh in need are able to secure a donor, leaving many without hope.

He stressed the importance of early detection in mitigating the longterm effects of kidney disease, saying diabetes and hypertension are major culprits. "These conditions often go undetected as they silently contribute to kidney failure," he said, adding that people, especially those with diabetes or hypertension, must seek immediate medical attention if they experience warning signs such as swelling of the face and feet.



said high salt and carbohydrate-rich diets impact kidney health. He called for a balanced diet rich in vegetables and proteins and warned against the consumption of processed foods, which can worsen kidney issues.

Dr Wani also highlighted the importance of hydration and recommended a daily intake of 1.5-2 litres of water to prevent infections and kidney stones, which are common causes of kidney failure. "Stress and the overuse of painkillers can also Regarding dietary habits, Dr Salim contribute to chronic kidney disease,"

he said.

He said chronic kidney disease is a "huge burden" on all countries including India. So, there is a need for increased awareness and action to promote kidney health.

World Kidney Day is observed annually on the second Thursday of March, and this year's theme is 'Healthy Kidney for All'.

Kidney disease ranks among the leading causes of death worldwide, surpassing even breast cancer and

### **Machine-Made Copperware Poses Formidable Challenge** to Traditional Craftsmen

**SRINAGAR, MAR 14:** For generations, the artisans of Kashmir have been renowned for their exquisite craftsmanship, creating intricate copperware using age-old techniques passed down through centuries.

From delicate tea sets to ornate bowls and vases, each piece is a testament to their mastery of the craft and reflects the region's rich cultural heritage.

As per news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), the machine-made copperware, however, for the last few decades has emerged a new challenge for the centuries-old copperware industry of the valley. Machine-made copperware is rapidly gaining

ground, posing a formidable challenge to the traditional craftsmen who have long dominated the market.

As a result, traditional Kashmiri copper artisans are finding themselves in a tough battle to compete with their machine-made counterparts. Many are struggling to adapt to the changing market dynamics, facing declining demand for their handcrafted

"We are facing unprecedented challenges from machine-made copperware. Our products may be crafted with care and attention to detail, but the onslaught by machine-made copperware had brought down its worth," said Abdul Aziz Lankar, a copperware artisans and a dealer.

He said the advent of modern manufacturing techniques and the rise of machine-made copperware have begun to disrupt this age-old industry.

"With advanced machinery capable of mass production, manufacturers can churn out copperware at a fraction of the time and cost required by traditional artisans. This shift has not gone unnoticed by consumers, who are increasingly drawn to the convenience and affordability offered by machine-made copperware," Lankar said.

Farooq Ahmad Misger, another copperware dealer said the industry is at the evrge of extinction due to the invasion by the machine-made copperware.

"This art is now not being imbibed by our younger generations. If government doesn't intervene, we will lose the art, hence the centuries old industry," he said. The artisans are hopeful of revival of the hand-made copperware industry especially after government announced measures to ban machine-made copperware.

Taking strict measures against machine-made copper, the government in January this year appointed Director of Handicrafts and Handloom (H&H) Kashmir as the person in charge of implementing the J&K Prohibition of Manufacture of Specified Copper Utensils (by machine) Act.

The step is aimed to combat the introduction of machines in crafting copper utensils which has resulted in marginalization of traditional artisans, and has allowed individuals without specific copper working skills to enter the industry, adversely affecting traditional craftsmen.

## ARRESTS MADE IN BATTERGAM FIRE TRAGEDY, ACCUSED APPREHENDED: POLICE

**KUPWARA, MAR 14:** The tragic fire incident in Battergam, Kupwara, on the night of March 3rd and 4th, 2024, resulted in the loss of life of Mohammad Feroz Alam. The commercial building owned by Sanaullah Mir was deliberately set ablaze, leading to this unfortunate loss.

As per the statement of Kupwara district police, Following thorough investigations, the Kupwara Police Station initiated proceedings under Section 174 of the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC).

It was determined that Abrar Ahmad Bhat and Zakir Ahmad Bhat were responsible for igniting the fire with malicious intent. Consequently, a case (FIR No. 54/2024) has been registered under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), including sections 302 (murder), 436 (mischief by fire), 420 (cheating), and 120B (criminal conspiracy). Both accused individuals fled to Punjab but were apprehended and brought back to Kupwara for legal proceedings.During interrogation, the accused admitted to setting the building ablaze



with the intention of fraudulently obtaining money from the insurance company. The Kupwara police team, under the leadership of Inspector Ishaq, SHO Kupwara, and under the supervision of Deputy Superintendent of Police Headquarters Kupwara, is diligently working to uncover all facts related to the case. Authorities are dedicated to ensuring iustice for the victims and holding the perpetrators accountable for their heinous actions. The Indian long-eared hedgehog (Hemiechinus collaris) is a small species of mammal native to northern India and Pakistan. The Indian long-eared hedgehog

is a relatively small hedgehog. It is a nocturnal animal that is often found inhabiting burrows. Similar to most hedgehogs it has spines on its back, embedded into a muscle sheath. The sheath forms a bag-like structure that the animal can hide inside for protection. It can also erect its spines to further protect from predators.

The Indian long-eared hedgehog has a well-developed set of senses because of its large ears, eyes and whiskers near its snout. These senses, especially smell, help them find food and/or a possible partner.



Tension over Ladakh calls for diplomacy; confrontation will be detrimental for the region



In recent years, Ladakh has emerged as a flashpoint for territorial control among India, China and Pakistan. Nestled in the Himalayas, the region has witnessed heightened tensions and military standoffs, casting a shadow over peace and stability. Amid this backdrop, India's External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has reiterated the pressing need for constructive engagement among all

Dr Jaishankar's remarks underscore a fundamental reality: The ongoing tension in Ladakh serves neither India nor China. Instead, it perpetuates a cycle of mistrust and escalatory actions that undermine the prospects of peaceful coexistence and regional prosperity. The Galwan Valley military standoff in 2020 highlighted the fragility of status quo and the urgent need for effective mechanisms to manage and de-escalate crises. Central to Dr Jaishankar's statement is the recognition that the resolution of tension in Ladakh requires a multifaceted approach that goes beyond conventional military posturing. While maintaining a robust defence posture is essential to safeguarding national interests, sustainable peace



hinges on dialogue, diplomacy and mutual respect for territorial integrity. To put things in perspective, the Ladakh dispute has roots in history, with the main cause being an illdefined, 2,100-mile-long border. Rivers, lakes and snow-caps along the frontier mean the line can shift, bringing soldiers face to face at many points, this sparking a confrontation.

The LAC is the de facto border between India and China, but vaguely defined. In this scenario, it is difficult to resolve the deadlock and ascertain the territorial boundary. India's stance on Ladakh aligns with its broader foreign policy objectives, characterised by a commitment to upholding the principles of sovereignty, territorial integrity and peaceful resolution of disputes. By emphasising the importance of dialogue and diplomacy, India seeks to create an environment conducive to constructive engagement with all stakeholders. The External Affairs Minister's

remarks also highlight the critical role of Pakistan in the regional dynamics. Pakistan's support for cross-border terrorism and its destabilising activities pose significant challenges to regional peace and security. Addressing the issue of terrorism is not only a prerequisite for normalising relations between India and Pakistan but also a vital step towards fostering stability in the South Asian region. As a responsible member of the international community, India advocates for concerted efforts to eradicate terrorism. By advocating constructive engagement and mutual respect, India seeks to pave the way for a stable and prosperous future for the region. Everyone involved should heed rational voices; the last thing anyone wants to hear is the sound of a nuclear explosion.

As we fast from sunrise to sunset, let us also fast from negative thoughts and actions. Let us use this month to cleanse our hearts and minds of hatred,


anger, and prejudice. Let us strive to be kinder, more compassionate, and more forgiving towards others.

## **Under 'One Nation, One Election', Fresh Polls In Case Of Hung Parliament, Assembly**

New Delhi: The High-Level Committee on 'One Nation One Election' led by former President Ram Nath Kovind in its report recommended that in the events of a hung Assembly or hung Parliament, or a no-confidence motion constitutes the new House, fresh elections may be held for the remainder of the five-year term.

Where fresh elections are held for the House of the People, the tenure of the House of the People will be only for the unexpired term of the immediately preceding full term of the House of the People and the expiration of this period shall operate as a dissolution of the House, the committee recommended.

The High Committe panel also recommended that elections to the Municipalities and the Panchayats be synchronised with the House of the People. Simultaneous polls to Lok Sabha, assemblies can



be held in the first step, followed by local body polls within 100 days in the second step. This will require ratification by not less than onehalf of the States.

Upon all-inclusive deliberations, the Committee concludes that its recommendations will significantly enhance the transparency, inclusivity, ease and confidence of the voters.

Overwhelming support for holding simultaneous elections will spur the development process

and social cohesion, deepen the foundations of our democratic rubric, and realise the aspirations of India, that is Bharat, the committee said. Former president Kvidled Committee earlier today called on President Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan and submitted its report on the 'One Nation One Election'.The 18,626 pages long report is an outcome of extensive consultations with stakeholders,

experts and research work over

191 days, since its constitution on

Other members of the Committee are Amit Shah, Union Minister of Home Affairs and Minister of Cooperation, Ghulam Nabi Azad, former Leader of Opposition in Rajya Sabha, NK Singh, former Chairman, of the 15th Finance Commission, Subhash C Kashyap, former Secretary General, Lok Sabha, Harish Salve, Senior Advocate, and Sanjay Kothari, former Chief Vigilance Commissioner. Arjun Ram Meghwal, Minister of State (Independent Charge) Ministry of Law and Justice was a Special Invitee and Dr Niten Chandra was the Secretary of the high level panel.

The Committee held extensive consultations to understand the views of different stakeholders. Forty-seven political parties submitted their views and suggestions, out of which 32 supported simultaneous elections. Many political parties had extensive discussions with the High level committee on this matter.

## **Electoral Bonds Data From SBI Uploaded On Election Commission Website**

New Delhi: In a big move towards transparency in political funding, the Election Commission of India has uploaded the data of the electoral bonds given to it by the State Bank of India. The details have been uploaded on Thursday, a day before the deadline set by the Supreme Court.

The data pertains to purchases of bonds of three denominations - 1 lakh,

10 lakh and 1 crore dating back to April 12, 2019, and reveals purchases by companies as well as individuals.

The EC's website has two lists. The first is of companies that purchased electoral bonds, along with the denomination and dates. The other has names of the political parties as well as the denominations of the bonds and the dates on which they were encashed.



There is, however, no way of correlating the lists and finding out which company or individual had donated to which party. Announcing that it has released the data, the poll body said in a statement, "The Election Commission of India has today uploaded the data on electoral bonds on its website as received from SBI on 'as is where is

basis'". "It may be recalled that in the said matter, ECI has consistently and categorically weighed in favour of disclosure and transparency, a position reflected in the proceedings of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and 2019 and February 15.

SBI, which is India's largest bank, had submitted the data on Tuesday and submitted the affidavit to the court the day after that. The affidavit stated that 22,217 electoral bonds were issued between April

### Himanta Sarma's Big Solar Infra, Green Energy Push In Assam

Guwahati: Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Thursday announced plans to bolster the state's solar power infrastructure. Mr Sarma said solar energy is a key sector in India's quest to become a global powerhouse in green energy."Prime Minister Narendra Modi has stressed on solar power. Under the PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijlee Yojna, the Central government will provide subsidy to everyone who applies for solar panels," Chief Minister Sarma said.

The Assam Chief Minister said that for every 1 KW of solar panel installation, the Central government will provide a subsidy of 30,000, supplemented by an additional 15,000 subsidy from the Assam government, while the applicant contributes 5,000. Scaling up, for 2 KW and 3 KW installations, the subsidies rise correspondingly, making solar power accessible and affordable for citizens across income brackets, he added. Currently,



Assam requires 2,200 MW of power to meet household electricity needs, a challenge that solar energy initiatives aim to address.The groundwork for Assam's solar revolution was laid in 2017 with the formulation of a solar policy, setting ambitious targets for energy generation within a timeframe. This policy gave birth to the region's first floating solar power plant in Thanagarh village in Morigaon district, boasting a capacity of 10.50 JW. The Assam government plans to replicate such initiatives across multiple wetlands, capitalising on Assam's natural resources to enhance electricity generation capacity.

### "Rahul Gandhi Should Publicly Explain His Opposition To CAA": Amit Shah

New Delhi: Union Home Minister Amit Shah has dismissed former Congress president Rahul Gandhi and his party's criticism of the Citizenship Amendment Act, rules of which were notified this week.

In the interview with ANI, the Union Minister challenged the Congress leader to appear on a public platform and put forth the case of his party on the issue.

"I request you to interview Rahul Gandhi about the issue in detail and explain his reason for opposing the CAA to the general public. In politics, it's your responsibility to justify your decisions. If the CAA is a decision by my government, I have to explain my party's position, the government's decision and why it is in favour of the nation. Similarly, Rahul Gandhi should explain his opposition to the legislation." Earlier Senior Congress leader and Rajya Sabha MP Jairam Ramesh had questioned the timing of the promulgation of the rules of the Citizenship Amendment Act. The Congress alleged that this was a controversial law because citizenship is never based on religion, it goes against the Constitution.

In reply the Home Minister said that the opposition was only indulging in politics of lies as the CAA had been a part of the BJP's manifesto for the 2019 Lok Sabha elections and was introduced in Parliament in 2019 itself.

"All opposition parties including Rahul Gandhi, Mamata or Kejriwal are indulging in 'jhooth ki rajneeti' (politics of lies) so the question of timing does not arise. BJP has made it clear in its 2019 manifesto that it will bring CAA and provide



Bill was passed in both houses of Parliament in 2019. It got delayed due to Covid. BJP had cleared its agenda well before the party got its mandate in the polls" the Home Minister said.

New Delhi: Joining the chorus for reforms in the United Nations Security Council (UNSC), Belarusian Foreign Minister Sergei Aleinik, who is currently on a visit to India, said Minsk would support India's call for a permanent seat in the world body.

Addressing a media briefing in the national capital on Wednesday, the Belarussian Foreign Minister stressed the urgency for reforms in the UNSC, adding, "We (Belarus) also discussed this issue and are convinced that UNSC reforms should be facilitated. It is a long-lasting issue which is being discussed within the UN, taking into account the very fragile situation in the world today."

"We also expressed ourselves during the 78th Session of the General Assembly and in our official statement during the 78 Session of the General Assembly, we made it very clear that we would support the accession of India to the Security Council," he added. Speaking on his meeting with his Indian counterpart S Jaishankar, Aleinik said, "We share views towards creating a more just, fair, and multipolar world order. We also hold the same views on the principles of international relations. So the core principles are equality of states and, the balance of interests of each and every country.""We also touched upon our cooperation in the SCO, as well as BRICS, and expressed our appreciation for the support that India extended to our application for full-fledged membership in the SCO," Belarussian FM added on his sit-down with External Affairs Minister Jaishankar. He said India was the first country to ratify the memorandum on Belarus' accession to the SCO, adding that he also discussed Belarus' membership of the BRICS during his talks with the EAM.

The two leaders also discussed regional and global issues, affirming to work towards further enhancing bilateral cooperation between India and Belarus to a 'strategic partnership' level, he added.

"We touched upon BRICS because Belarus also applied for full-fledged membership of the grouping. We look forward to positive consideration by the growing number of member states of BRICS since the last summit in Johannesburg," Aleinik said.

### ACB Apprehends Junior Engineer for Bribery

Handwara, Mar, 14: In a significant development in the fight against corruption, the Anti Corruption Bureau (ACB) has arrested Arshid Hussan Marazi, a Junior Engineer (JE) from the Rural Development Department Block Qaziabad in Handwara. Marazi was apprehended for accepting a bribe amounting to Rs 5,000. The arrest follows a complaint received by the ACB, alleging Marazi's solicitation of a bribe to expedite the preparation of bills related to work executed under MGNREGA. The complainant reported instances of undue delays in bill processing, attributing them to Marazi's demand for illicit payments.In response to the complaint, the ACB swiftly launched an investigation under the provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act 1988. Subsequent-

ly, a trap operation was orchestrated, leading to Marazi's apprehension. During the operation, Marazi was caught red-handed while demanding and accepting the bribe of Rs 5,000 from the complainant. Following his apprehension, Marazi was taken into custody by the ACB team. The bribe money was recovered from his possession in the presence of independent witnesses, bolstering the case against him.This arrest underscores the ACB's unwavering commitment to rooting out corruption from public offices and holding accountable those who engage in malfeasance. It serves as a stern warning to individuals who seek to abuse their positions for personal gain. The ACB urges citizens to continue reporting instances of corruption, reaffirming its resolve to maintain transparency and integrity in public service.(HT)















## Pant leads star-studded list of IPL returnees

#### **Rishabh Pant**

In December 2022, when Pant suffered severe injuries in a horrific car accident, there were doubts about whether he would be able to play cricket again. Fourteen months later, his return as captain of Delhi Capitals is cause for celebration, and not just for Capitals. But we'll have to see how Pant copes with the demands of batting, captaincy, and possibly wicketkeeping, in arigorous IPL season after such a long time out of the game. He's had three knee liga $ment \, constructions, skin \, grafts \, on \, his \, back$ and thighs, several stitches, therapy, and months of rehabilitation at the National Cricket Academy in Bengaluru to get here.

Pant's return will add firepower to the Capitals batting line-up, especially in the middle and death overs, phases in which they were the slowest scorers last season, when they finished second from bottom. And if he has a promising IPL, a place in India's T20 World Cup squad is not out of the question either.

Having missed IPL 2023 because of a back stress injury, Bumrah heads into the

new season in peak bowling form: he took 19 wickets in four Tests against England at an average of 16.89. He hasn't played a T20 sinceIndia's tour of Ireland in August 2023, though, and his last white-ball game was the ODI World Cup final on November 19. Bumrah was given a break for the fourth Test of the series against England to manage his workload, which could need monitoring while at Mumbai Indians too, with India going straight into the T20 World Cup a week after the IPL final.

Iyer had to skip the last IPL with a back injury and has had surgery since, and he goes into this season as captain of Kolkata Knight Riders on the back of a rocky couple of months.

He had a stellar ODI World Cup in October and November, but not long after, Iyer lost his spot in India's T20I and Test teams,  $and then \, his \, BCCI \, central \, contract \, after \, not$ playing in the Ranji Trophy despite not being on international duty. Reports of more back trouble surfaced but he eventually bounced back with a fluent 95 for Mumbai in the Ranji final.

Iyer needs a strong IPL season to re-

#### establish himself. **Pat Cummins**

Cummins opted out of IPL 2023, sacrificing his INR 7.25 crore (US\$874,000 approx.) paycheque with KKR in the process, so that he could focus on international cricket in a busy year. He ended up leading Australia to the World Test Championship title, retained the Ashes in England, and then won the ODI World Cup in India.

His stocks skyrocketed and, after being released by KKR, Cummins became the first player to be sold at an IPL auction for more than INR 20 crore. Sunrisers Hyderabad have since made him their captain for the 2024 season, too.

Cummins, however, has not had great success in the IPL over the years.

In his most recent season, 2022, he took  $seven wickets in five \, matches \, for \, KKR \, with \,$ an economy rate of 10.69. He has never captained a team - country, state or franchise - in T20 cricket before and faces the challenge of uniting a diverse dressing room and reviving Sunrisers' fortunes. Under different captains - David Warner, Kane Williamson and Aiden Markram-SRH finished last in 2021, eighth in 2022, and

last again in 2023.

After missing the last eight seasons, Starc returns to the IPL as its most expensive player ever: he was bought by KKR for INR 24.75 crore (US\$2.98 million approximately) after fierce bidding from Mumbai Indians, Capitals and Gujarat Titans.

But Starc comes into the IPL without a lot of recent white-ball experience. His last ODI was the 2023 World Cup final in November, and before he played two T20Is against New Zealand this February, his previous T20Is were during the 2022 T20 World Cup. Starc has played only two IPL seasons previously, for Royal Challengers Bangalore in 2014 and 2015, and while he had entered the auction in 2018 - he was bought by KKR then too - he withdrew ahead of the season. While Starc's international pedigree is what got him the record bid, he now has to deliver. He will begin the season against Cummins when KKR play Sunrisers at Eden Gardens on March 23.

Williamson's first season for Titans lasted barely an hour on the field. In the 2023 season opener against Chennai Super

Kings, he leapt at the boundary to attempt a catch, landed awkwardly, busted his anterior cruciate ligament, and only returned to international cricket during the ODI World Cup in October after recovering from knee surgery.

Titans need an experienced hand in the team, as Shubman Gill prepares for his first season as IPL captain following Hardik Pandya's trade to Mumbai Indians, and Williamson will be crucial.

#### **Jonny Bairstow**

Bairstow was unavailable for Punjab Kings in IPL 2023 as he recovered from surgery after fracturing his leg in September 2022. He comes into this season having spent two months in India for a five-Test series, which culminated in his 100th appearance in whites for England in Dharamsala.

He was explosive for Kings in the 2022 season, scoring 253 runs at a strike rate of 144.57, though he averaged only 23. It remains to be seen whether Bairstow features among the team's four first-choice overseas players at the start of this season, as they attempt to qualify for the playoffs for the first time since 2014.

# Sixteen counties in the running for eight women's teams

**CHRISTCHURCH:** Sixteen of the 18 first-class counties have bid for one of eight professional women's teams in a revamped England and Wales domestic competition starting next season.

Worcestershire and Derbyshire are the only two clubs among those invited to tender who have confirmed that they did not bid for a Tier 1 team under the new structure.

Essex and Glamorgan made formal announcements on Wednesday while Surrey, Lancashire, Sussex, Hampshire, Nottinghamshire, Warwickshire and Gloucestershire all confirmed this week that they had lodged tenders with the ECB.

Middlesex confirmed a bid on Monday, which had received "the full support of Marylebone Cricket Club". MCC, which owns Middlesex's home ground, Lord's, and was also invited to bid for a team, have not submitted a proposal of their own.

Kent and Northamptonshire announced their bids last week along with Durham, Yorkshire, Leicestershire and Somerset. It is understood counties will be notified imminently of interview slots for the next stage of the process, with those interviews to take place by the end of March.

In February, the ECB invited all 18 first-class counties plus MCC to tender for one of the Tier 1 clubs in a move away from the current regional structure which began in 2020. Currently, teams contesting the 20-over Charlotte Edwards Cup and 50-over Rachael Heyhoe Flint Trophy fall under central ECB control and largely encompass more than one county. By aligning teams more closely with existing counties - and their men's teams - the ECB is seeking to address an identity crisis that has afflicted some of the regional teams



with ownership, responsibility and governance shifting to the clubs.

First-class counties not awarded Tier 1 status, plus all National Counties, will be invited to take part in a process to determine the make-up of Tier 2 and 3 competitions, comprising 10-14 teams and 16-20 teams respectively.

Despite there being no plans for promotion or relegation from 2025-28, Derbyshire have taken a longerterm view, electing to "pursue the establishment of a sustainable Tier 2 women's structure, one which will hopefully grow into Tier 1 status" in future. Derbyshire have hosted training for existing regional women's team the Blaze over the winter and staged at least one England Women's international fixture every year for the past seven seasons. In 2020, Derby hosted all five T20Is against West Indies which comprised the England Women's international season amid the initial wave of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Explaining the club's position, Derbyshire chief executive Ryan Duckett said: "Derbyshire makes up 9% of the population of the Midlands, yet 26% of women's cricket that was

played across the region in the last year involved a team from the county. There are also three players in the current senior England squad who have come through the Derbyshire pathway, which has been led by the Derbyshire Cricket Foundation, and we will continue to support further success in this area.

"Our ambitions for ground development include enhanced training facilities underpinning a robust pathway structure, as well as increasing seating capacity to meet demand and ensure the club retains its status as a host venue for international women's cricket... After honest assessment, we felt that in the short term, as a standalone county, it may have been essential to compromise what is currently being delivered as a collective across the region and therefore believe this decision is in the best interest of the game." Worcestershire CEO Ashley Giles told the club's podcast: "At this point it would just be more a funding and a resource issue for us. Even in ground facilities, changing facilities, practice wickets, it would be really challenging for us.
