### **J&K Witnesses Multiple Encounters, Attacks in First Three** Months of 2025

**SRINAGAR, APR 2**, KNT: The first quarter of 2025 saw a rise in encounters, militant attacks, and cross-border hostilities across Jammu and Kashmir, leading to multiple casualties.

The first quarter of the year was marked by many encounters between militants and security forces. In Zaloora Gujjarpati forest area of Sopore, an exchange of fire led to the killing of a soldier, Pangala Kartheek. A fierce gunfight in Krumhora Rajwar Handwara resulted in the killing of a foreign militant, while a police officer sustained injuries. In the Sanyal Hiranagar area of Kathua, an infiltration bid turned into an armed confrontation, leaving a minor nonlocal girl injured in the crossfire as militants managed to escape.

The most deadly encounter occurred in the Sufian forest area of Juthana in Kathua, where four policemen, including Head Constable Jagbir Singh and Selection Grade Constables Tariq Ahmad, Balwinder Singh Chib, and Jaswant Singh, were killed. Seven other security personnel were wounded, while two infiltrators were neutral



## Amit Shah to Visit J&K on **April 7-8 to Review Security Situation**

SRINAGAR, APR 2: Union Home Minister Amit Shah is scheduled to visit Jammu and Kashmir on April 7 and 8 to assess the security situation in the region, particularly in the wake of the recent gunfight in Kathua that left two militants and four police personnel dead.

Shah's visit is expected to focus on strengthening countermilitancy operations and reviewing security arrangements ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's scheduled visit on April 19. Modi is set to inaugurate the first train to Kashmir from Katra, making infrastructure security a top priority for law enforcement agencies.

During his stay, the home minister will chair a high-level security review meeting with Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, top officials from paramilitary forces, intelligence agencies, the J&K Police, and civil administration. The discussions will center around counterterrorism measures, border security, and the protection of vital instal-

Srinagar, Apr 02: Nearly 75000 people visited Asia's largest Tulip Garden, located at the foothills of the Zabarwan Mountains here, on first two days of Eid-ul-Fitr, while the number of total visitors since its opening on March 26 has crossed one and a half lakh

mir are dreaming big, just like their peers across the country. Statistics reveal a significant drop in violence, and assembly elections were conducted in a peaceful environment. For the first time in 40 years, election campaigns continued till midnight.'

NORMALCY ORGANIC, NOT FORCED

LG Sinha said that people who are saying that "forced normalcy" has been established in J&K are giving a wrong notion. "Not a single commander of any terror outfit is alive. Local recruitment into terror groups has reduced to zero. Had this been a forced normalcy, schools wouldn't have reopened, Bollywood and Hollywood wouldn't be shooting films here, and the industry wouldn't be investing in Kashmir. Cinema halls have reopened, and Muharram processions were allowed after more than three decades," he said, as per KNO.

LG Sinha said that Kashmir has moved past its turbulent past. "If you visit the riverfront along the Jhelum at night, you'll find youngsters playing the guitar and enjoying coffee. We have established a 'Balidan Stambh' in Lal Chowk, where Army and security forces officers now pay tribute to their fallen colleagues. The number of stakeholders in peace has increased significantly," he added.

ALL WERE ON BOARD TO DISMISS ANTI-**NATIONALS** 

The LG emphasized the government's commitment to eliminating terrorist sympathizers from state institutions. "We have adopted a whole-of-government approach to dismantle the terror ecosystem. Those within the government who support terrorism have to be removed.'

On the termination of Syed Salahuddin's sons and Syed Ali Shah Geelani's grandson from government service, LG Sinha said, "All were on board that they had to be removed. Terrorist outfits played a key role in destroying J&K, and I fail to understand why previous governments engaged in talks with them. Under this regime, there will be no dialogue

with such elements.' LG Sinha took a dig at politicians for claiming that unemployment in J&K has increased, he said, "So far, we have provided more than 40,000 government jobs in a transparent manner. No one has been appointed through a backdoor.'

Referring to the assembly elections held in 2024 in J&K, he said, "The Centre has stood by its commitment to hold polls in J&K. Our goal was to establish peace and drive development, and I hope the elected government will continue on this path."

He said that the J&K Reorganization Act has clearly defined the roles of the elected government and the LG administration. "We must work within our respective boundaries to take Jammu and Kashmir forward on the path of development," the Lieutenant Governor said, as per KNO.

A grenade attack on the 163 Territorial Army unit in Hamray Pattan, Baramulla, caused significant damage to an MI Room, leading to the arrest of three suspects. In another incident, militants shot dead an ex-serviceman, Manzoor Wagay, in Bihibagh, Kulgam, leaving his wife and niece injured. In Goripora Bomai Sopore, Army personnel opened fire, killing a truck driver, Waseem Mir, under circumstances that triggered widespread outrage.

The period also witnessed a series of crossborder hostilities and sniper attacks. In the Makri area of the Bhawani sector in Rajouri, an accidental blast left six army personnel injured. A soldier, Puran Singh, was wounded in a sniper attack in the Nowshera sector, while another soldier suffered injuries in a similar incident in Akhnoor. An IED blast in the Akhnoor sector claimed the lives of two soldiers, including a captain, while another was injured. Additionally, a soldier was wounded in a sniper attack in Poonch, prompting a brief exchange of fire with Pakistani troops. Another IED explosion rocked the Nakarkote area along the LoC in Poonch.

Militants also intensified attacks on security forces in Rajouri's Sunderbani sector, where an army vehicle came under fire, leading to a massive cordon and search operation. In another incident, unidentified gunmen hurled a grenade at a police post in Old Town Baramulla. Security forces resorted to firing after detecting suspicious movement in Sun $derbani, indicating \\ \bar{h}eightened \\ vigilance \\ amid$ increased militant activity.

Joint forces intensified search and cordon operations in the Panitirthi area of Kathua following an exchange of fire with militants. Based on intelligence inputs, a joint team of the Indian Army, Jammu and Kashmir Police, and CRPF has deployed multiple ambushes and surveillance teams in the region.

The operation escalated after suspicious movement was detected on the night of March 31, leading to a fresh encounter. A searchand-destroy mission was launched at first light on April 1, and the operation is still in progress with forces maintaining a high state of alert.

The Rising Star Corps of the Indian Army confirmed the developments on X, stating: "Acting on intelligence inputs, multiple surveillance cum ambushes were deployed in general area Panjtirthi, Kathua by Indian Army, JK Police and CRPF. Suspicious movement was observed on the night of March 31, leading to an exchange of fire. Search and destroy operations launched at first light on April 1. Operations in progress."

Meanwhile, the army in a statement, said that a mine blast occurred in Krishna Ghati Sector due to Pakistan Army intrusion across LC. This was followed by unprovoked firing and a ceasefire violation by the Pakistan Army. Own troops responded effectively in a controlled and calibrated manner. The situation is under control and being closely monitored.

of the Indian Constitution. "India is a secular country, and the Constitution guarantees freedom of religion to all its citizens. Muslims from Jammu and Kashmir and across the country have made immense sacrifices for India's independence, and the government must respect their rights

and aspirations," Yaseen said. Mirwaiz Umar Farooq in post on X also said, "As one watches the ruling party defend the indefensible Waqf Amendment Bill in Parliament, it is very unfortunate and disturbing that not even one of the serious concerns and reservations raised by Muslim organisations, including the Muttahida Majlis-e-Ulema (MMU) which I lead, before the JPC in New Delhi, was addressed by them. Today, crores of Muslims in India, like mute spectators, are haplessly watching their rights and institutions being blatantly undermined and feel greatly let down." (SIC)

Regarding maintenance of quality and adherence to specific timelines, the Chief Secretary asked the R&B department to take penal action against the defaulting contractors as per law or blacklist them for taking

It was added that the delay in procurement of electromechanical components by the contractor lead to termination of the contract with the remaining works to be retendered and expected to be completed in seven months at a cost of Rs 40.16 crore.

About the 160-bedded new block of Bone & Joint Hospital, the meeting was apprised that the construction has been fully completed. It was given out that the procurement of additional equipments are in progress and scheduled to be completed by the end of this

Regarding upgradation of 49 Dewatering Stations, Commissioner SMC, Owais Ahmad, informed the meeting that 45 stations are fully functional with 2 stations at Khan Colony and Surnai Mohalla dropped while 2 at Zero Bridge and Peerbagh foreclosed.

With respect to status of the Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system for these dewatering stations, it was told that the same had been completed at a cost of Rs 32.12 crore and handed over to SMC. This system aims at monitoring and controlling dewatering stations in Srinagar for their efficiency and effective output.

It is worth mentioning here that the total expenditure incurred on [TFRP till date stands at Rs 1,547.5 crore, with the World Bank reimbursing an amount of Rs 1,465.86 crore. The project has been extended until August 31,2026, allowing completion of the remaining works that were not completed till December, 2024 for different reasons.

rable breakthroughs. "While other nations are pioneering AI, we remain consumers rather than creators of this technology. If we do not act now, we risk becoming a digital colony, dependent on foreign innovations,"

To counter this trend, Sinha outlined several key measures. He stressed the need for universities to integrate cutting-edge research into their curricula and foster stronger ties with industries. He praised the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 as a transformative step toward promoting critical thinking and interdisciplinary learning.

Additionally, he highlighted the growth of Jammu and Kashmir's startup ecosystem, noting that over 1,000 startups, including many led by women, have been registered in the region. "I have had the privilege of attending convocations in nearly every university in Jammu and Kashmir. The most satisfying thing for me is that in every convocation I attend, at least 70% of gold medals are won by girls. Over 70% of graduates are girls. The youth are full of energy. We must ignite the fire within them so they can move forward with new energy and strength."

Referencing Kalhana's 11th-century work Rajatarangini, which described the region as the sacred abode of Goddess Sharada, the embodiment of knowledge, Sinha linked this historical legacy to modern-day challenges, urging students and educators to reignite India's tradition of innovation.

Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) scheme. The initiative aims to augment the monthly food requirements of AAY households within the Public Distribution System (PDS).

The decision, formalised through a government order, a copy of which lies with the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), reads that the additional foodgrains will be allocated on a case-by-case basis, with the total foodgrains entitlement per AAY beneficiary not exceeding 10 kilograms per month under all PDS schemes, including the National Food

Security Act (NFSA). The allocation of free foodgrains will vary according to the number of beneficiaries in each AAY household, with a detailed breakdown of additional rice allocations based on the number of individuals in the household.

For example, households with up to 10 members will be entitled to an additional 35 kg of rice, while those with larger families may receive even higher quantities, based on a formula specified in the circular. Rice, which is currently available under the Open Market Sale Scheme (Domestic), will be provided to

eligible beneficiaries at no cost. The Finance Department has been authorized to allocate additional budgetary support for the implementation of the scheme, which will be recouped into the Revolving Fund (Foodgrains) Accounts of the respective directorates.

The government has also indicated that once the Department of Food & Public Distribution of the Government of India resumes  $the \, sale \, of \, wheat \, under \, the \, Open \, Market \, Sale$ Scheme (Domestic), the option of providing wheat and wheat flour to AAY households will be explored, subject to approval by the Competent Authority.

"In a major pro-people decision, fulfilling the promise made in Budget 2025-26, the Government of J&K will now provide additional food grains FREE of cost to all AAY households under PDS. Each beneficiary will get up-to 10 kg of food grains, ensuring enhanced food security for our most vulnerable families," Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said-

(FY) 2023 to an estimated 18,439 MU in FY 2025.

Along with this reduction in power demand, the energy not supplied has significantly decreased, dropping from 317 MU in FY 2023 to 87 MU in FY 2025, showcasing improvements in energy distribution.

This was revealed by the Ministry of Power in response to queries in the Lok Sabha, as reported by the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO).

The Ministry said electricity is a concurrent subject, and the responsibility for supply and distribution falls under the jurisdiction of the respective state governments or power utilities.

"The Government of India has been supporting various initiatives to improve the power supply infrastructure in these regions, including schemes such as the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gram Jyoti Yojana (DDUGJY), Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS), and Pradhan Mantri Sahaj Bijli Har Ghar Yojana (SAUBHAGYA). These programmes are designed to enhance the quality of power supply and ensure access to electricity for all consumers, it said.

Under the DDUGJY, 129 villages in Jammu and Kashmir have been successfully electrified. Furthermore, the SAUBHAGYA scheme has facilitated electricity access for 3,77,045 households in the region. Despite these significant strides, remote and mountainous areas continue to experience intermittent power supply due to existing infrastructure limitations.

### **CANCER**

of State for Health and Family Welfare, as reported by the news agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO), revealed that the region recorded a total of 67,037 cancer cases from 2018 to 2024. The numbers have steadily risen each year: 12,726 cases in 2020, 13,060 in 2021, 13,395 in 2022, 13,744 in 2023, and 14,112 cases in 2024.

In light of this surge, the government has focused on improving cancer care facilities across the country. As part of efforts to tackle the rising burden of cancer, 19 State Cancer Institutes (SCIs) and 20 Tertiary Cancer Care Centres (TCCCs) have been established nationwide to provide advanced cancer treatment. Additionally, cancer treatment facilities have been approved for all 22 new AIIMS hospitals, equipped with diagnostic, medical, and surgical services.

The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has been at the forefront of cancer research, funding various projects and initiatives aimed at improving cancer diagnostics, therapeutics, and understanding of cancer biology. The ongoing research emphasizes the development of novel, affordable, and accessible cancer therapies.

Jammu and Kashmir, in particular, has been making strides in cancer care infrastructure. The region boasts two State Cancer Institutes, two Tertiary Cancer Care Centres, 20 Day Care Centres, and 11 District Hospitals providing Palliative Care services. This network aims to address the growing cancer burden in the region.

The incidence of cervical cancer in Jammu and Kashmir has also shown a concerning increase. Data from 2019 to 2023 revealed the following cases: 612 in 2019, 632 in 2020, 648 in 2021, 666 in 2022, and 684 in 2023.

To combat the rising rates of non-communicable diseases, including cancer, the government has approved Rs 24 crore under the National Programme for Prevention and Control of Non-Communicable Diseases (NP-NCD) in Jammu and Kashmir under the National Health Mission (NHM) for a period of three years.

# **Decoding the Waqf Bill: Myths vs. Facts Uncovered**

**7**ith certain political entities and vested interest groups within the Muslim community deliberately spreading misinformation to stir unrest, the Waqf Amendment Bill 2024 has become a lightning rod for controversy. The bill, aimed at ensuring transparency, curbing corruption, and streamlining the administration of waqf properties, has been distorted beyond recognition by these groups, who seem more concerned with protecting their own privileges than the welfare of the community.

#### The Truth Behind the Amendment

The resistance to this bill primarily comes from those who have long benefited from the lack of transparency in waqf institutions. Historically, certain groups have held significant control over wagf assets, and their identities are well known. Their opposition is not driven by genuine concerns for religious rights but by a desire to maintain their hold over vast properties and financial resources that have been mismanaged for years. If their intentions were truly aligned with the welfare of the community, can they explain why the income from wagf properties has been consistently declining year after year?

One of the main distortions being peddled is the claim that the bill enables the government to seize legitimate waqf properties. In reality, the amendment merely empowers the District Collector to review misclassified properties, especially cases where government or private lands have been wrongly designated as waqf. This measure ensures rightful ownership and protects against fraudulent claims, benefiting both the community and the larger public interest.

Another widely circulated myth is that the bill abolishes the survey of waqf properties. On the contrary, it strengthens the process by assigning the responsibility to the District Collector, who will conduct surveys using established revenue procedures, thereby eliminating inaccuracies and potential manipulation by vested interests.

#### Exposing the Hypocrisy of **Opponents**

The most vocal critics of the bill, have long been the principal beneficiaries of waqf assets. Their opposition is a calculated move to safeguard their financial empires built on these properties. These organizations have historically monopolized waqf resources, diverting funds meant for the underprivileged sections of the community towards their own agendas.

The hypocrisy is stark! While they claim to champion the cause of the Muslim community, they have, for decades, manipulated waqf boards for personal gains. Many waqf boards in India are staffed by individuals affiliated with these groups, who continue to exploit these endowments for political and financial leverage. It is this unchecked exploitation that the amendment seeks to end, making them the loudest opponents of reform.

#### **Strengthening Waqf for the True Beneficiaries**

Beyond breaking the monopoly of select groups, the bill enhances inclusivity by mandating representation from various Muslim sects, including Sunni, Shia, Bohra, Aghakhani, and backward Muslim communities, ensuring fair and democratic governance of waqf assets. Furthermore, the introduction of non-Muslim experts to the waqf boards does not threaten Muslim control but rather enhances accountability, bringing in external oversight to prevent mismanagement.

The bill also introduces financial audits and transparent accounting practices, preventing misuse of waqf funds. Periodic reporting requirements and the ability to appeal waqf tribunal decisions in High Courts will further strengthen legal oversight, ensuring that waqf properties serve their intended purpose, benefiting the needy and preserving India's rich syncretic

#### The Need for Reform

The government's move to remove the 'Waqf by User' provision is another crucial step toward eliminating ambiguity in waqf property claims. This provision has been misused to illegitimately claim lands without formal waqf dedication, leading to endless legal battles and land encroachments. By streamlining registration processes, the amendment safeguards both private and public lands from wrongful claims, ensuring that only legally declared waqf properties receive recognition.

#### The Way Forward

The Waqf Amendment Bill 2024 is a progressive step toward ensuring the transparency and efficient management of waqf properties. Its provisions are designed to protect legitimate waqf assets, improve governance, and dismantle the entrenched interests that have long profited from these resources.

It is imperative for the Muslim community to see through the misinformation and recognize that those opposing this bill are doing so for their own benefit, not for the greater good. By supporting this reform, we can ensure that waqf properties are used for their true purpose-uplifting the underprivileged and preserving the cultural and religious heritage they were meant to serve.



# **Govt's duty cut to US imports** threatens Kashmir's farmers

The Central government's decision to reduce or eliminate import duties on U.S. apples, walnuts, and almonds (bowing to American pressure) poses a grave threat to Kashmir's already struggling farmers and its fragile economy. According to the Economic Times, India currently imposes a standard 42-120% duty on almonds, 50% on apples, and 100-120% on walnuts. Lowering these barriers will flood the market with cheaper US imports, crushing Kashmir's horticulture sector, which contributes over 75% of India's apples and nearly 98% of its walnuts.

For decades, Kashmiri growers have battled policy neglect, inadequate marketing strategies, outdated technology, poor infrastructure,

climate change, high production costs, and unstable prices. Now, they are being forced into unfair competition with those farmers who thrive on subsidies, lowinterest loans, and institutional support. Meanwhile, Kashmiri farmers, despite their resilience, are left to fight alone. How is this a level playing field? What happened to 'Vocal for Local' and 'Atmanirbhar Bharat'?

The consequences of this decision will be devastating. With cheaper foreign alternatives flooding the market, local farmers will be compelled to sell at a loss, leading many to abandon the sector altogether. This will trigger mass unemployment, affecting transporters, traders, labourers, and thousands of families dependent on horticulture. Economic distress will deepen, aggravating social problems like drug addiction and instability. Mere anti-drug campaigns won't address the crisis when livelihoods are being systematically destroyed.

The government must protect domestic horticulture by maintaining fair tariffs, providing direct subsidies, and investing in modern infrastructure. Strengthening marketing support, ensuring MSP (Minimum Support Price), and boosting exports will help Kashmiri farmers compete globally.

If the government genuinely believes in 'Atmanirbhar Bharat,' it must stand with its farmers, not against them. A nation that cannot protect its own growers can never claim true selfreliance. Kashmir's horticulture is not just an industry; it's a lifeline for thousands. It must be defended.

Srinagar, 2nd April 2025: JK People's Party Chief Sheeban Ashai today while addressing press lambasted Modi regime's high handedness vis-a-vis Waqf Amendment Bill. He said, "We all know what became of hundreds of amendments put forward by opposition party members in the Joint parliamentary committee. Opposition vociferously complained that its voice was not heard, Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) on the Waqf (Amendment) Bill accepted only 32 out of the more than 500 amendments moved. With BJP and its allies having numerical majority, all amendments moved by them were accepted, those put forth by Opposition were downright rejected. Opposition members moved amendments to all the 44 clauses, specifically seeking to delete 28 of these to restore the law to the 1995 principal Act. Opposition members had moved amendments opposing the institution of separate Waqf Boards for Aghakhani and Bohra sects. They also moved an amendment to remove clause 9 that allows inclusion of two non-Muslim members to the Central Wakf Council. All the 11 Opposition MPs moved an amendment to remove clause 40, which seeks to delete the provision that allows non-Muslims to also donate property to Waqf, from the original Act. In a joint statement, 11 panel members from Opposition said they were stopped from placing their views on the amendment and that no discussion on clause by clause was permitted by the chairman. 95 % of the stakeholders who deposed before the panel opposed the Bill. In grave departure from the established rules.

# Waqf amendment bill an unconstitutional assault on Muslim religious rights: Hakeem Yaseen

Among the do's list, it has asked to close windows, vents, and other openings to prevent embers from entering." Move animals and valuable goods to safer locations. After adventure activities, ensure that no bonfire or flame is left unattended," reads the guidelines.

While among the don'ts, it has asked to avoid smoking near vegetation or forested areas and not to panic in case of a sudden fire. Refrain from entering the forest during a fire incident. With regard to prevention and preparedness measures, it has asked to keep emergency contact numbers of district fire services and forest authorities readily available.

From key road networks to water supply schemes, tourism, defence and 4G saturation, these approvals will pave the way for enhanced connectivity, economic progress and improved public services. A total of 302 cases have received final approval and 84 cases have received In-Principle approval from the government between January to March this year. The signifies government's broader vision of development, prioritising projects that address long-standing infrastructural gaps and further improve the public ser-

Delay in land acquisition and forest clearances were some of the reasons for these projects being stalked or running behind schedule and at times leading to cost



overruns. A number of projects related to road development have been granted approval, enabling timely implementation of key initiatives.

The diversion of forest land will support construction and improvement of roadways, including highways and local roads. These roads are vital for enhancing connectivity and facilitating the movement of people and goods across Jammu and

Major road and highway projects approved recently included clearance of the remaining patch of Package-17 of Delhi-Katra Expressway in Jammu, Kishtwar-Nildori-Bangus-Gali-Lokut-Bangus Dangiyari Road in Kupwara district by BRO, Jallary to Badharket Khaitan road by PWD in Poonch district.

Additionally, the forest land has been cleared for establishment of various water supply schemes under the Jal Jeevan Mission. These projects aim to provide safe and adequate drinking water to every household, especially in rural and remote

The approval for these schemes will contribute significantly towards improving the water infrastructure, making water more accessible to the residents of Jammu and Kashmir.

Across the UT of J&K, in the past three months, 271 Water Supply Schemes have been approved in 7 districts of J&K including Baramulla, Budgam, Doda, Jammu, Kishtwar, Ramban and Udhampur.

Further, in order to ensure 4G Saturation under USOF, 11 proposals for construction of communication towers and 4 proposals for laying of OFC have been approved recently across 8 districts of J&K.

In line with the Forest (Conservation) Act, compensatory afforestation will be undertaken for the forest land diverted for these projects. This will include reforestation of degraded forest land to maintain ecological balance and mitigate any potential environmental impact caused by these developmental activities.

These environmental clearances have been approved following a high level meeting between J&K Minister, Javed Ahmed Rana and Union Minister for Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Bhupender Yadav, in New Delhi in January




